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**Councilor's Reports**

Councilor Graham White Division #1

- Need to order larger road name signs, example is Vandale Road off of Hryciw Road, lettering too small/Albert Johnson is still waiting for work to be done in field, pooling of water along Valley View Road/Councilor has met with Tyler Kondra, Engineer, they are going to come up with three scenarios of alternate routes for construction of Ike Thiessen Road around Porter Lake/council will meet on site to determine the best route/cost of construction, purchase of land and ease of construction.

Councilor Ryan Zdunick Division #2

- Where is the municipality regarding containers/are we allowing them/having them removed/whatever.

Councilor Kevin Kirk Division #3

- Meeting with the cemetery committee to determine where to install the base or pad for a columbarium or mausoleum/pour the pad this fall so that we can purchase the columbarium and install in the winter/gravel driveway completed at cemetery/have issues with Keith Jorgenson's sheep, continually getting out/there was an error with wage increases to Charlene and Maxwell/we have permission to mow the Highway 41 ditches within the boundaries of the municipality.

Councilor Real Hamoline Division #4

- Where are we at with a new solicitor for tax enforcement/check to see if we can get a loan to borrow, a loan to start construction on south grid/some of the back roads have lumps on the sides/when moving fields during harvest we are hitting these lumps and equipment is getting damaged/the mulcher should be used more to level out the ridge that is left on side of road/back roads should be mowed first before maintaining road to Jake Neufeld's needs to be mowed and maintained.

Councilor Paul Martens Division #5

- Backroads need more maintaining/rocks picked and some work done at the ravine/the 1<sup>st</sup> Responders vehicle, fire truck and response truck need to have an oil change/We need to monitor the traffic to the rail bridge repair, overweight permits and maintenance of the road/rocks need to be picked on some of the backroad and ditches/some of the larger stones need to be removed from the ditches/roads not wide enough for some equipment to pass without hitting something and causing damage.

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Councilor Jim Korpan Councilor #6

- Shawn Graham would like a culvert installed in the Fleury Grid, culvert was covered up or missed during construction/Shawn Graham would like a gate installed on access to his pit from grid road/some of the roads east of the bridge need to be mulched/road where sloughs have dried out need to be mowed/could the municipality build up or reshape the road to the Laniwci Church cemetery, also this road needs gravel/the ditch on the north & south of Real Hamoline's yard needs to be leveled, so that the water can flow.

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
