BYLAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICES

The EPS Management Officer will be around focusing on the following:

1. **Nuisance Bylaw 02/06 (Yard Clean-Up)**
To provide for the abatement of nuisances, including property, activities, or things that adversely affect:
 - a) the safety, health or welfare of people in the neighborhood;
 - b) people's use and enjoyment of their property; or
 - c) the amenity of a neighborhood.
2. **Animal Control Bylaw 01/07**
Every owner of a dog or cat within the Town shall cause each such dog to be registered with the Town office.
3. **Civic Addressing 07/13**
Each house or building shall bear the civic number assigned to the lot.

***TOWN COUNCIL WILL BE APPOINTING A PEST CONTROL OFFICER (to deal with any mouse or rat population) AND A PREDATOR CONTROL OFFICER (to deal with any problem crows) AT OUR MAY 20, MEETING.**

NEW OCP AND ZONING BYLAW FOR THE TOWN OF ABERDEEN

All land within the Town of Aberdeen as shown on the Future Land Use Concept is affected by the new Official Community Plan.

The new Official Community Plan and Zoning Bylaw will help direct and manage growth and development in the Town of Aberdeen for the next fifteen to twenty years.

Any person may inspect or ask questions about the proposed OCP and Zoning Bylaw at the Town Office between 9:00 am to 12:00 pm and 1:00 pm to 5:00 pm, Monday to Friday, excluding statutory holidays. Copies are available to persons at a cost of \$30 or download from the following website:

Council will hold a public hearing at 7:00 pm on June 17th, at the Community Hall to hear any person or group that wishes to comment on the proposed Bylaw. Council will consider written comments received at the hearing or delivered to the undersigned at the Town Office before the hearings.

Road Closures

Parts of the Aberdeen South Grid and Gordon Road are still under water and will remain closed until further notice. The RM does not condone driving on any ice road or road that may have water over it. Road Closed signs are placed for your protection and are not to be ignored.

The Municipality would like to extend our gratitude for your understanding as we deal with impassable roads, and road closures.

Pest Control Officer/Weed Inspector

Denis Boyenko is the new Pest Control Officer/Weed Inspector for the Rural Municipality of Aberdeen. If you suspect a rat infestation on your or a neighbouring property, please call Denis or the RM office to report it. Rat poison can be picked up at the Office during regular business hours. Creating a rat-free province involves a team effort. The Pest Control Act clearly identifies that the responsibility for controlling & destroying pests resides with every person who owns, occupies, or controls land & buildings. That Includes ALL OF US!!

Landfill Hours

Open Wednesday and Saturday from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Located on the SW 12-39-03-W3.

The transfer site has a waste disposal bin for household refuse which is not recyclable or burnable. Several sites have been marked for items such as white metal, burnable etc. Painted wood is not considered as burnable. We do not accept shingles, tires and oil. You will be turned away from the transfer station. Transfer Station is pay per use for household garbage. Please contact the RM or Town Office for

prices. Household recyclables and compostable materials may be taken free of charge if placed in the proper pile or bin.

The site is manned and the gate is locked at all times, except during operating hours as indicated. The municipality will not tolerate garbage being dumped on municipal roads. There is a \$500.00 fine for anyone caught dumping garbage in the municipality, and the municipality will prosecute anyone that fails to pay the fine. DO NOT TAKE TV'S, ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT, ANIMAL PARTS, CARCASSES, TIRES, BATTERIES, FARM CHEMICAL CONTAINERS, GRAIN, OR OIL CONTAINERS AT ANY TIME!!

Controlled Burn

With the warm weather approaching more people are planning control burns. We would like to remind you that, as per Bylaw 2001-09, only small bonfire pits are allowed within the country residential developments without a burn permit. Please notify the office at 306-253-4312 of all control burns within the RM. If a passing motorist phones in to report a fire that you have not registered with the Municipality, we will be

forced to fine you \$500. It only takes a moment to make the call. After hours and weekends, please contact the deputy fire chief Adrien Hamoline at 306-230-1503.

The RM of Aberdeen charges \$500 for ALL fire calls that have our Fire Fighters leave the fire hall. As you are aware, grass fires can travel at rapid rates and risk to land and property can be disastrous in a short period of time. If our fire department deems it necessary to call in adjacent fire fighters from neighboring municipalities, ALL costs and charges will be forwarded to the person responsible for starting the fire. This can add up to thousands of dollars in a very short period of time. Contact your insurance provider to ensure you have sufficient firefighting coverage to protect yourself in case of fires.

Building and Development Permits

The RM of Aberdeen would like to remind all of you that permits are valid for 12 months from date of issue. If an extension is required, please submit your request in writing along with your signature to the RM office. Extensions will only be granted for up to 6 months from the date your permit expired.

TEN COMMANDMENTS OF VOLUNTEERING

by Bruce Raymond, June 4, 1997; Canadian FundRaiser

1. Be a willing volunteer

Once you have agreed to volunteer your time to a given cause or event, make sure that you not only give it willingly, but also that you appear to others to have given it willingly: do not say or do anything that would indicate otherwise. Particularly, do not imply by subtle remarks that you were dragged into volunteering. **God loveth a cheerful giver.**

2. Make your energy effective

Don't take on so much that you can't do the job properly. In particular, don't take on a responsibility just to prevent someone you don't like from taking on the job.

3. Radiate Enthusiasm

for what you are doing so that you will contribute in a positive way to the morale of other volunteers. If you can't perform your volunteer task without grumbling at how difficult the task is, the job's too big for you. Get out of the way and let someone else take the job who will take the pleasure in it.

4. Be loyal

Give the same loyalty to your organization, its officers and your fellow volunteers as if your volunteer work was how you earned your living. **Don't bad mouth anyone, ever.**

5. Don't be an Armchair General

He hasn't the right to criticize who hasn't the heart to help. If one of your responsibilities is to assess the performance of others, remember to **criticize in private, praise in public.**

6. Be Generous

Make the words "**thank you**" the most commonly used words in your vocabulary.

7. Value the time of others

Be punctual. Just because you're a volunteer doesn't give you the right to keep others hanging about because you can't organize yourself to be on time. **Value other people's time just as you want your own time to be valued.**

8. Don't be a gossip

Discourage fellow volunteers (and even paid staff) from imparting "secrets" to you that are damaging to other volunteers. Be your own person. Belong to no cliques. **Don't load yourself with other people's baggage.**

9. Never Threaten to Quit

without actually quitting. A threat to quit is valueless the second time you utter it. Unless you stood by that threat the first time, you will become marked as the kind of insecure person who uses threats as a ploy to get their own way.

10. Share your knowledge

Above all, teach another volunteer as much about your job as you can, so that if anything happens to you, the organization or the event is not left in the lurch.

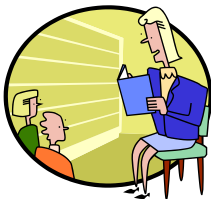

How do I subscribe?

You can subscribe for \$20/year. You can also subscribe to the electronic version (in colour) for free. Call or email the editor to be added to the mailing and/or electronic distribution list.

How do I submit an ad?

If you have an ad that is currently in print that you need to make changes to, please make changes and re-submit as a new ad. When submitting your ad make sure it is print ready as it will appear how you submit it. Please note that there may be minor changes to your ad for formatting purposes.

There are two ways to submit your advertisement:

1. Drop off a hard copy of your ad to the Aberdeen Post office
2. Email your ad as an attachment (preferred method)
 - a. Accepted formats: Microsoft Publisher (.pub), Word (.doc), Excel (.xls), JPEG (.jpeg)
 - b. Narrow margins page set up.

How much does it cost to run an ad?

Business Card size \$25.⁰⁰/10 issues

1. Quarter page or less \$8.⁰⁰/issue
2. Half page or less \$15.⁰⁰/issue
3. Full page or less \$30.⁰⁰/issue
4. ** payment due upon submission **
5. Preferred payment is cheque

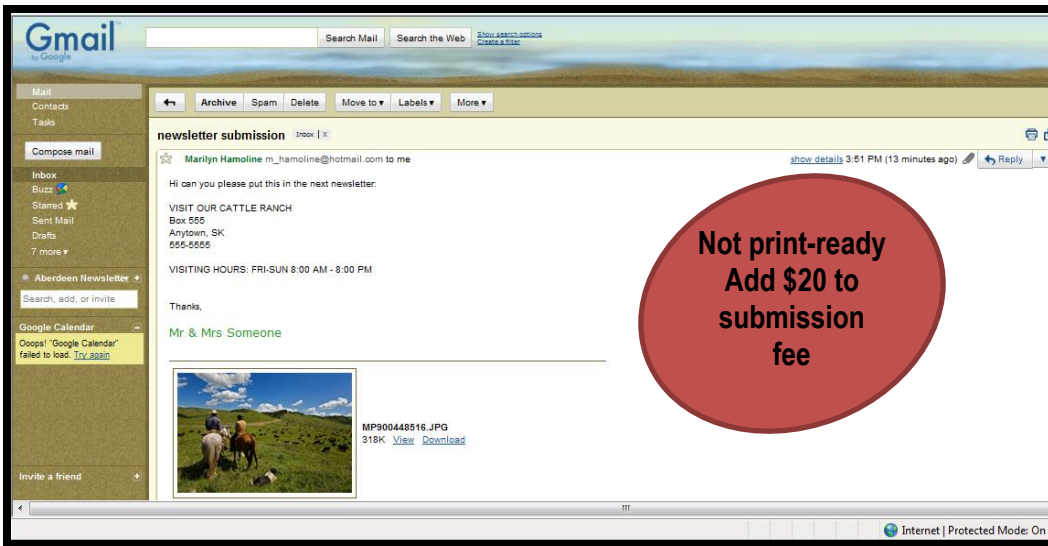

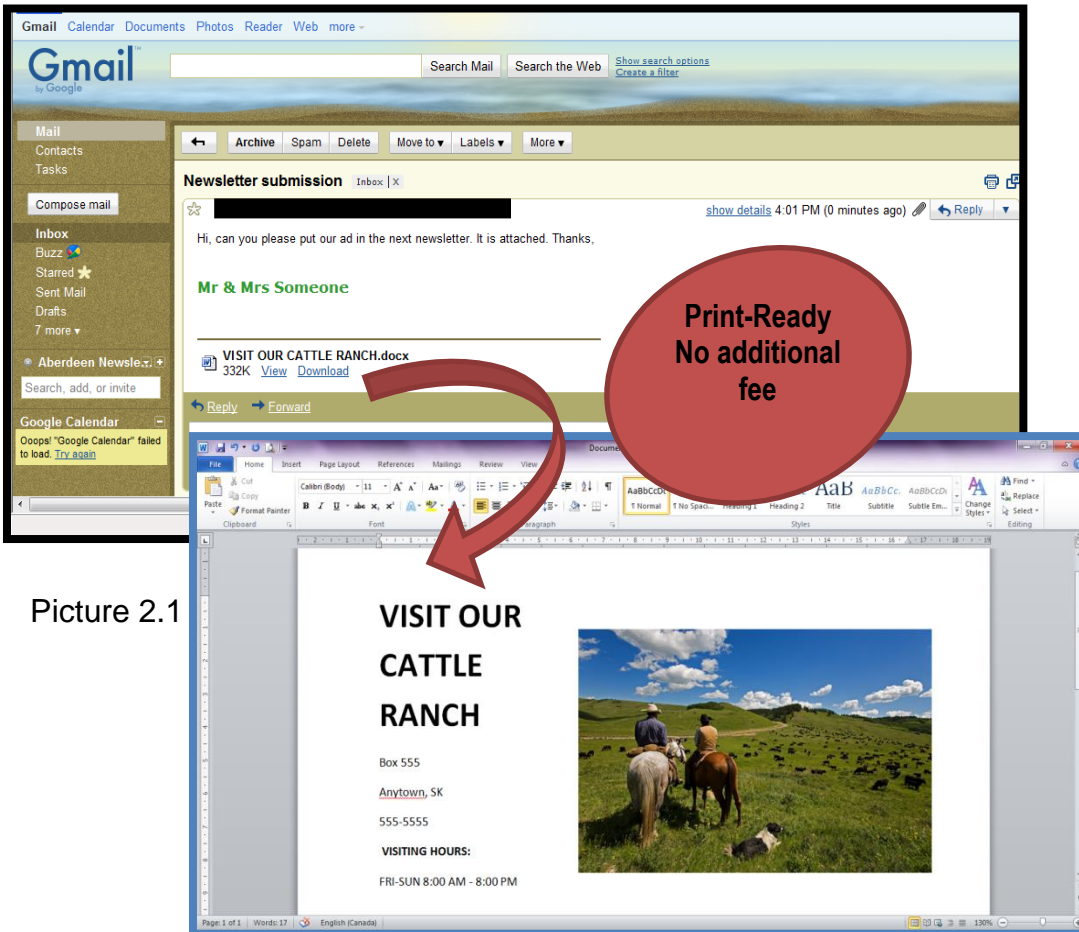
