BUSINESS LICENSE - Bylaw No. 12-14

The Town Council of Aberdeen has adopted a new Business Bylaw 12-14 that requires all businesses whether store front, home based, any trades or professions to obtain a Business License.

All businesses must register with the Town of Aberdeen annually. Any fees to <u>local business</u> located in Aberdeen will be waived for 2015 **ONLY**, but will commence in 2016. All <u>non local</u> trades are subject to 2015 fees.

NEW BUILDING CANADA FUND GRANT APPLICATION

The Town Council of Aberdeen has applied to the Federal Government for funding for a much needed new lagoon and lift station. Should we be selected, a total of \$3,000,000 is needed. Funds to be shared 1/3 each by the Federal and Provincial Government's and the Town of Aberdeen. An increase to our "Infrastructure Fee" to \$35 per month will be utilized to help fund this project. The infrastructure fee will become effective when approved by the Local Government Committee.

There are no registration fees for cats, but failure to register could result in a fine.

Bylaw 01/07 states that failure to register your animals can result in fines of \$50.00 per animal.

If our fire department deems it necessary to call in adjacent fire fighters from neighboring municipalities, ALL costs and charges will be forwarded to the person responsible for starting the fire. Contact your insurance provider to ensure you have sufficient firefighting coverage.

Please note that all unpaid taxes as of December 31st start collecting 1% interest per month. Interest is added on the 1st of every month. All Unpaid Invoices as of Dec 31st have been added to the tax roll and are collecting 1% interest.

Transfer Station Hours

Open Wednesday and Saturday from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Located on the SW 12-39-03-W3. The transfer site has a waste disposal bin for household refuse which is not recyclable or burnable. Several sites have been marked for items such as white metal, burnable etc. Painted wood is not considered as burnable. Transfer Station is pay per use for household garbage. Please contact the RM Office for prices. Household recyclables and compostable materials may be taken free of charge if placed in the proper pile or bin.

The site is manned and the gate is locked at all times, except during operating hours as indicated. The municipality will not tolerate garbage being dumped on Municipal roads. There is a \$500.00 fine for anyone caught dumping garbage in the municipality, and the municipality will prosecute anyone that fails to pay the fine.

Plowing Snow

We would like to remind everyone that plowing snow onto or across municipal right-of-way is NOT a permitted practice. Guilty Parties will be subject to Fines. Plowing snow across the roadways creates ridges that settle and harden, creating serious hazards to motorists, grader operators and potential damage to graders.

Aberdeen and District Charities Inc. - Aberdeen Rec Complex Board of Directors 2014 Annual Meeting President's Address by Blaine Tomolak

2014 proved to be another challenging yet successful year. Our financial situation is by enlarge the biggest hurdle we face every day. Manager Jordan, Bookkeeper Mandi and Board Treasurer Dana juggle daily to keep stability and momentum our main focus. Constant ice plant and facility geothermal troubles keep the maintenance costs very high and are the main challenge to operations. As our facility ages, we must be diligent with maintenance and upkeep. Power is our largest cost, and we look at ways to reduce consumption.

Our hockey ice is in high demand due to good relations, quality product and the growth of the city. Jordan is continuing where Don left off by nurturing those relationships and providing high quality experience to our patrons; local, with the Aberdeen minor hockey association, public skating and two broomball clubs, as well as several groups from Saskatoon. Dry land training space, quality ice, hot showers, and clean dressing rooms are some of the amenities, with offerings from Paullina's Cafe and Catering to round out the package available here at the ARC. Our facility shines clean and bright thanks to the hard work of Julie Martens.

Curling numbers are down slightly this year with only Wednesday and Thursday curling. We had interest in Friday night but not enough to run a full rink, so the decision to cancel left some locals disappointed. The snowmobile rally proved to be a successful fundraiser, and will be again this December 27th as plans are in place for the 2nd annual. The commitment of curling club President Ryan Norman and the curling club Directors allows us the rewards of quality curling ice and a great looking facility. Through grant applications, marketing strategies and successful fundraisers they have provided the curling club with EZ sheets, making the ice better and brighter, and a heating system to make the experience more enjoyable.

Our playschool group managed by Janet Buhler is now 15 strong which means our community is growing and finding the Rec Complex to be a valuable resource. The Wheatland library continues to be a popular venue with librarian Ann Maille being open three days a week with story time, a book club, and other activities. Public skating is available again this winter on Wednesday afternoons; a skate maintenance center is open and available with supplies; Jordan's' Gym and Health Center is accepting new members.

The Dance Aberdeen group continues to thrive and we are glad to have them. The local taekwon-do club has also seen an increase in numbers. A local business operates their office in our complex. Our bowling alley is open and ready for business. League bowling can start anytime, as that will nicely compliment the weekend fun had there by our out of town guests.

Our lounge continues to be an enjoyable place to visit as our Joana cheerfully sets up the bar, teaming with Paullina's for snack orders. We find the busy nights as Wednesday and Thursday after curling and hockey, and some tournament weekends as well.

It seems we have it all here, in our little self made corner of paradise. For those that use our facility, that s the image we want to portray. Those that ARE our facility understand the commitment it takes to put out that message. Those of us that are the facility need more help to make our place better and even more attractive.

Fundraising efforts, like to one made by our own Real and Adrian Hamoline and crew, raising over \$31,000 by seeing an opportunity to grow a canola crop on land donated by Northland Logistics; Or like Dan Fletcher, Ken Kruger and Shawn Letkeman seeing an opportunity for the last three years by growing wheat and canola on a portion of land the Town owns, and donating those profits to the Rec Complex. These are perfect examples of our friends and neighbors going beyond themselves and committing to selflessly donating their time and efforts for the good of the community. We should also mention the Hopper bin lotto committee, lasting for 17 years raising over \$1.5 million for the complex to pay for the mortgage. Many other examples of past individuals and groups that have put in time and efforts to make our community better are known - just look at around our facility to see the memories and plaques on the walls. Its fundraisers like these that built our Rec complex.

It's like a continuum that needs to flow; The only way for this center of our community to continue is to have that flow continue. It's up to us all to do our part and be a part of the community we raise our families in.

Learn to Train:** The emphasis of this course is on technical and tactical development within a small sided game environment (6v6), (7v7), (8v8). You'll learn how to teach basic principles of play and how to establish training ethics and discipline in a fun and challenging environment. **April 11-12.**
