The RM of Aberdeen charges \$500 for ALL fire calls that have our Fire Fighters leave the fire hall. If our fire department deems it necessary to call in adjacent fire fighters from neighboring municipalities, ALL costs and charges will be forwarded to the person responsible for starting the fire.

Pest Control Officer/Weed Inspector

Denis Boyenko is the Pest Control Officer/Weed Inspector for the Rural Municipality of Aberdeen. Rat poison can be picked up at the Office during regular business hours. Please call Denis at 306-220-8996 to report all suspected rat infestations.

Transfer Station Hours

Open Wednesday and Saturday from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Located on the SW 12-39-03-W3.

The transfer site has a waste disposal bin for household refuse which is not recyclable or burnable. Several sites have been marked for items such as white metal, burnable etc. Painted wood is not considered as burnable. Transfer Station is pay per use for household garbage. Please contact the RM Office for prices. Household recyclables and compostable materials may be taken free of charge if placed in the proper pile or bin.

The site is manned and the gate is locked at all times, except during operating hours as indicated. The municipality will not tolerate garbage being dumped on Municipal roads. There is a \$500.00 fine for anyone caught dumping garbage in the municipality, and the municipality will prosecute anyone that fails to pay the fine.

Garbage Bins

Garbage bins must be kept off the road allowance except for Tuesdays when garbage pickup is scheduled. Garbage bins left on the roads interfere with the road crew's ability to effectively maintain the roads and ditches. Garbage bins left on roadways can also serve as a safety hazard to other motorists. The Rural Municipality will not be responsible for any damages caused by the graders if your bins are not back a minimum of 150 feet from the center of the municipal right of way.

Status Update: Pinnacle Ridge Estates & Golf Course

On September 15th, 2015, Council passed the second reading. Council has now entered into negotiations for the servicing agreement with Pinnacle Ridge.

Discretionary Use Applications

The RM council has received two applications for discretionary Use Permits. The first is from Maxie's Excavating to renew their permit to operate a Gravel Pit. The Public hearing will be held October 7th, 2015 at 7:00 pm at the RM Office. The second is from the Saskatoon Wildlife Federation to set up a gun range next to the Saskatoon Gun Club. The Public Hearing will be held October 7th, 2015 at 8:00 pm at the RM Office. Written Submissions for both applications must be received by the RM Office Staff on or before noon the 7th of October, 2015.

PDAP

(Provincial Disaster Assistance Program)

The Town of Aberdeen has applied to the PDAP program for assistance to those who received damage (not covered by your insurance) from the heavy rains we experienced August 5 and 6, 2015.

Should we be considered by PDAP as a disaster stricken area claim forms will be made available.

PDAP is not a substitute for private insurance nor does it provide full compensation for losses. Instead, the program covers damages to uninsurable, essential property. Eligible claims can include clean-up costs, replacement of essential household items, structural repair and restoration, and preventative measures taken during a disaster. **WATCH FOR UPDATES!**

ANIMALS RUNNING AT LARGE

Bylaw No. 1/07

Section 4. RUNNING AT LARGE

The owner of a dog or cat shall not at any time allow the dog or cat to run at large within the Town.

When a dog or cat is found to be running at large, its owner is deemed to have failed or refused to comply with the provisions of this section.

Where a dog or cat is found running at large, the owner or occupant of that property on which the dog or cat is running at large may make a written complaint to the by-law enforcement officer.

Section 2. DEFINITIONS

"running at large" means that the dog or cat is beyond the boundaries of the land occupied by the owner, possessor, harbourer, or keeper of the said dog or cat, or beyond the boundaries of any lands where it may be with permission of the owner or occupant of the said land and is not under control by being:

- i. On a leash or harness and in direct and continuous charge of a person competent to control it; or,
- ii. securely confined within an enclosure; or,
- iii. securely fastened so that it cannot roam at will.

The emergencies that the EMO team deal with are not the routine fire or medical responses but rather they are the extremely rare large scale responses such as extreme flooding, tornado, air crash, hazardous material spill, etc. We support our emergency responders by making sure they receive all that they require in order to deal with the emergency.

The time commitment for this position is fairly minimal, about 8 one hour meetings per year and usually on a Tuesday at 7 pm.

Introducing the New COPP Program

As you may have heard we are starting up COPP program for the town of Aberdeen. This is a completely volunteer program that is designed to assist local police by being an extra set of eyes and ears in our community to help reduce the crime element in our area.

What We Will Be Doing

We will be driving around our community keeping an eye open for anything out of the ordinary making notes and reporting to the RCMP.

What you can do to help

If you are not able to participate in patrols or you live outside the town you can still help by getting as much information as possible like license plate colour and make of the vehicle or description of persons. Reporting anything you feel suspicious to the RCMP by calling 310-RCMP (7267) or 911 if it is an emergency.

Things you can do to help reduce crime in our neighbourhood.

1. **KEEP THINGS LOCKED UP.** A lot of crimes are crimes of opportunity
2. **KEEP VALUABLES OUT OF SITE.** Reduce temptation by not displaying articles that other people may perceive as desirable.
3. Have functional motion sensing lights.
4. Report Suspicious activity to the RCMP.

Aberdeen & District Fire & Rescue

Fire Prevention Week ~ October 4-10, 2015

Hey Kids (Kindergarten to Grade 3) enter the draw to be **"Fire Chief for a Day"**. You could get some pretty cool things, get picked up & dropped off in the fire truck for school. Get the details from your teacher - the week of Fire Prevention.

Fire Safety Starts at Home...

Most fatal fires in Saskatchewan start in the home. Kitchen fires are the #1 cause of home fires. You can protect your family and property by taking these fire steps.

Smoke alarms save lives ONLY when they are working

- Test smoke alarms at least once a month – push the test button.
- Install new batteries at least once a year or when your alarm “chirps” with a low battery warning.
- Smoke alarms do wear out – replace every 10 years.

Make an escape plan

- Plan and then practice your escape. Every member of your family should know at least two ways out from every room.
- Make sure open doors and windows are easy to open. When escaping from an upper story window, plan a safe way to the ground.
- Pick a meeting place outside the home where every member of the family can gather once they’ve escaped.
- Know your local emergency number and call from a cell phone or a neighbor’s house. Wait safely outside for the Fire Department to arrive.

Child fire play

- Children are fascinated by fire. Teach them about the dangers of fire and put fire starters out of their reach.
- Store matches and lighters up high or locked in cupboards.
- Don’t leave children unsupervised around candles or open flames.
- Teach your children their part in the family escape plan.
- Let children know they should tell an adult if they find matches or lighters lying out – never to touch them.

Heat safety

- Keep space heaters and wood stoves off when you go to bed or leave the house.
- Always turn space heaters off when you go to bed or leave the house.
- Never leave children alone with a working fireplace, wood stove or space heater.
- Use a metal spark screen on your fireplace.
- Have your chimney inspected once a year by a professional. Clean chimney and flue pipes of creosote build up.
- Burn only dry, seasoned wood in wood stoves and fireplaces.

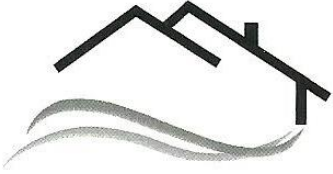
Big fires start small

- Don’t give fire a place to start. Keep things neat. Clear clutter and combustibles out of basements – particularly near furnaces and hot water heaters.
- Never leave stove on, unattended. Use pot cover to smother fire.
- Do not overload an electrical outlet.
- Store flammable liquids – like paint thinners and gasoline – outside the home.
- Leave fire fighting to the experts. Fire grows surprisingly fast. Don’t waste precious seconds trying to control any but the smallest fire. Get everyone out and call the Fire Department from a safe place.
- Fire safety is a way of life. Make an escape plan and practice it regularly. Put reminders to check smoke alarms on the family calendar – and when the date comes up – make the check. Make a regular fire safety inspection and correct any hazards you find.

2. Email your ad as an attachment (preferred method)
 - a. Accepted formats: Microsoft Publisher (.pub), Word (.doc), Excel (.xls), JPEG (.jpeg)
 - b. Narrow margins page set up.

How much does it cost to run an ad?

Business Card size \$25.⁰⁰/10 issues

1. Quarter page or less \$8.⁰⁰/issue
2. Half page or less \$15.⁰⁰/issue
3. Full page or less \$30.⁰⁰/issue
4. ** payment due upon submission **
5. Preferred payment is cheque
