#### COUNCIL'S CORNER

#### BUSINESS LICENSE - Bylaw No. 12-14

The Town Council of Aberdeen has adopted a new Business Bylaw 12-14 that requires all businesses whether store front, home based, any trades or professions to obtain a Business License.

All businesses must register with the Town of Aberdeen annually. The deadline to register has been extended to February 29<sup>th</sup>, 2016. Conducting a business without a license can result in fines of \$200.00.



#### SEWER & WATER RATES BYLAW - Bylaw 12-15

Bylaw 12-15 introduces a new sewer rate structure that will implement a sewer charge based on the amount of water used.

Total Site

This will eliminate the \$20 flat rate. The new sewer charge is \$6.00 per 1000 gallons of water consumed.

Dogs – Spayed or Neutered: \$25.00




There are no registration fees for cats, but failure to register could result in a fine. Bylaw 13-2015 states that failure to register your animals can result in fines of \$100.00 per animal.

## Controlled Burn

Please notify the office at 306-253-4312 of all control burns within the RM. <u>All Controlled burns taking place After hours and</u> weekends, must be reported directly to the deputy fire chief Adrien Hamoline at 306-230-1603.

The RM of Aberdeen charges \$500 for ALL fire calls that have our Fire Fighters leave the fire hall. If our fire department deems it necessary to call in adjacent fire fighters from neighboring municipalities, ALL costs and charges will be forwarded to the person responsible for starting the fire.

## Plowing Snow

We would like to remind everyone that plowing snow onto or across municipal right-of-way is NOT a permitted practice. Guilty Parties will be subject to Fines. Plowing snow across the roadways creates ridges that settle and harden, creating serious hazards to motorists, grader operators, and potential damage to graders.

## Transfer Station Hours

Open Wednesday and Saturday from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Located on the SW 12-39-03-W3. The transfer site has a waste disposal bin for household refuse which is not recyclable or burnable. Several sites have been marked for items such as white metal, burnable etc. Painted wood is not considered as burnable. Transfer Station is pay per use for household garbage. Please contact the RM Office for prices. Household recyclables and compostable materials may be taken free of charge if placed in the proper pile or bin.

The site is manned and the gate is locked at all times, except during operating hours as indicated. The municipality will not tolerate garbage being dumped on Municipal roads. There is a \$500.00 fine for anyone caught dumping garbage in the municipality, and the municipality will prosecute anyone that fails to pay the fine. The Transfer Station is no longer accepting old Propane Tanks.

## Garbage Bins

Garbage bins must be kept off the road allowance except for Tuesdays when garbage pickup is scheduled. Garbage bins left on the roads interfere with the road crew's ability to effectively maintain the roads and ditches. Garbage bins left on roadways can also serve as a safety hazard to other motorist. The Rural Municipality will not be responsible for any damages caused by the graders if your bins are not back a minimum of 150 feet from the center of the municipal right of way.

## One2One Health Clinic for Farm Families

The RM of Aberdeen is looking into hosting a One2One Respiratory or Hearing Clinic for Farm Families. "The purpose of these clinics are educational, with a focus on increasing awareness of respiratory and hearing hazards on the farm, how to reduce risk from these exposures and how to maintain respiratory and hearing health." Clinic would be open to males and females age of 18 years and older who are ratepayers. If you would like more information regarding this clinic, please contact our office by phone or email.

## **Building Permits**

Building permits are only valid for 12 months from the date on the permit. All expired building permits must be closed in a timely manner. To book an inspection, contact BuildTECH consulting & Inspections at 306-370-2824. No Building is to be occupied until after it has had a final inspection and has been deemed safe to occupy by BuildTECH & the RM Council.



# ABERDEEN AND DISTRICT FIRE AND RESCUE

## A few winter safety tips from your local fire department...

- > Never leave burning candles and plugged in electric heaters unsupervised
- > Check furnace filter monthly & replace filters as needed
- > Never store flammable products around furnace or hot water tank.
- > Ensure energy efficient furnace vents are not obstructed by any objects. Intake vents should be checked weekly for ice buildup.
- > Only use clean well-seasoned (1-year) wood in wood burning stoves and fireplaces.
- > Check and clean chimney regularly as needed.
- > Test smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors monthly push the test button.
- Smoke alarm and carbon monoxide batteries should be replaced yearly.
   Smoke alarms should be replaced every 5 years
  - $\cdot Carbon$  monoxide alarms replaced every 10 years or as per label on pkg.
- > Check fire extinguisher for expiration date.






