ABERDEEN EASTER "MIRACLE" TREE

We would like to thank everyone for their support with this fundraiser. It was a huge success!

I am thrilled with the response and exposure we have received.

Here are some of the highlights:

- When our tree had about 1200 eggs on it, I posted about our tree on a Saskatchewan
 Photography Facebook page, and everyone there got excited that there was going to be
 something different to take pictures of. Thus many photographers payed a visit to Aberdeen in
 search of the perfect picture of our tree.
- The photographers took it upon themselves to spread the word sending pictures to other sites, newpapers and other media's – pictures were shared and comments were made by as far away as South Africa.
- Our Facebook page went crazy, I was getting message after message asking questions about the tree. People from across Canada and USA wanted to donate, so we opened up our sales of eggs again. The farthest locations I sold eggs to were Ottawa, BC, New Jersey and California.
- At that point I made the executive decision that it was important that the tree fill up, so I put on a 2 for the price of 1 sale. Sold out in 1 day basically. On Good Friday, a group of local people went out and hung the rest of the eggs to the maximum of 2664 eggs.
- Again out comes the photographers ©
- There were a couple special requests the clump of gold eggs were a memorial donation from a local family in memory of their daughter and sister, and if you looked closely at the tree there were 2 baby blue eggs hung in memory of the little boy who was lost and found drown in Manitoba (requested by a lady in Winkler, Manitoba). I asked Joanne –our most supportive photographer- if she would come out and take pictures of the blue eggs. She did a wonderful job focusing on the blue eggs while making the twinkle of the background eggs turn into little hearts. Photos of these eggs have been sent on to the family of the little boy in remembrance.
- I have had requests from Alberta, Manitoba and 2 towns in Sask. for advice on how to do this as a fundraiser.

There are a few people who need a special thank you! Without you this would have never have happened. Kelly and Candace Ens, AND Renee and Scott Horner, - thank you for getting those eggs to the top of the tree! The committee who helped organize the whole project – you did an awesome job as we struggled through our 1st year. Brenda and Carol Wudrich, Paulette Hudon and Carolyn Hoffert for stringing all the ribbons on the eggs. Thanks to everyone else who came out in the cold to hang eggs on the tree. A special thanks to all the people and businesses who sold eggs for us. And the biggest THANK YOU to all of you for sponsoring the eggs.

We look forward to next year – for bigger and better! We now have approximately 3700 eggs for next year. You will have to wait till next year to see what we do with them ©

ALL TERRAIN VEHICLE ACT

A person must be 16 years of age and hold a valid driver's license to operate an ATV in any public area.

Youth between the ages of 12 and 15 can operate an ATV but cannot drive on roads/streets and must be supervised by someone who holds a driver's license. Helmets must be worn by drivers and passengers at all times.

: 250

No person shall operate an ATV: (a) on any private land; or (b) on any road/street or any portion thereof within town limits, except for the purpose of crossing the said roads / streets to the closest point of exit; (c) any municipal land in the municipality; and (d) must not operate between the hours of 10:30pm and 7:00am.



Controlled Burn

Please notify the office at 306-253-4312 of all control burns within the RM. <u>All Controlled burns taking place After hours</u> and weekends, must be reported directly to the deputy fire chief Adrien Hamoline at 306-230-1603.

The RM of Aberdeen charges \$500 for ALL fire calls that have our Fire Fighters leave the fire hall. If our fire department deems it necessary to call in adjacent fire fighters from neighboring municipalities, ALL costs and charges will be forwarded to the person responsible for starting the fire.

Transfer Station Hours

Open Wednesday and Saturday from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Located on the SW 12-39-03-W3.

The transfer site has a waste disposal bin for household refuse which is not recyclable or burnable. Several sites have been marked for items such as white metal, burnable etc. Painted wood is not considered as burnable. Transfer Station is pay per use for household garbage. Please contact the RM Office for prices. Household recyclables and compostable materials may be taken free of charge if placed in the proper pile or bin.

The site is manned and the gate is locked at all times, except during operating hours as indicated. There is a \$500.00 fine for anyone caught dumping garbage in the municipality, and the municipality will prosecute anyone that fails to pay the fine. The Transfer Station is no longer accepting old Propane Tanks.

Garbage Bins

Garbage bins must be kept off the road allowance except for Tuesdays when garbage pickup is scheduled. Garbage bins left on the roads interfere with the road crew's ability to effectively maintain the roads and ditches. Garbage bins left on roadways can also serve as a safety hazard to other motorist. The Rural Municipality will not be responsible for any damages caused by the graders if your bins are not back a minimum of 150 feet from the center of the municipal right of way.

Building Permits

Building permits are only valid for 12 months from the date on the permit. All expired building permits must be closed in a timely manner. To book an inspection, contact BuildTECH consulting & Inspections at 306-370-2824. If an extension is required, please submit your request in writing along with your signature and the itemization of the work still required to be completed to the RM office. No Building is to be occupied until after it has had a final inspection and has been deemed safe to occupy by BuildTECH & the RM Council.

How do I subscribe?

Black and white copies are provided for free to anyone who rents a post office box from the Aberdeen post office. Don't have an Aberdeen post office box but want to receive a copy in the mail? You can subscribe for \$20/year. You can also subscribe to the electronic version (in colour) for free. Call or email the editor to be added to the mailing and/or electronic distribution list.

How do I submit an ad?

If you have an ad that is currently in print that you need to make changes to, please make changes and re-submit as a new ad. When submitting your ad make sure it is print ready as it will appear how you submit it. Please note that there may be minor changes to your ad for formatting purposes.

There are two ways to submit your advertisement:

- 1. Drop off a hard copy of your ad to the Aberdeen Post office
- 2. Email your ad as an attachment (preferred method)

a. Accepted formats: Microsoft Publisher (.pub), Word (.doc), Excel (.xls), JPEG (.jpeg)

How much does it cost to run an ad?
