12th-15th. Fair, then turning stormy, including the prairies.


16th-19th. Storms clear Saskatchewan-Manitoba area and all points west; turning colder.



Mayors Corner

One year is complete and this is our year in review. Town applied and successfully received a grant for new lift station and lagoon. Construction is well under way. We reconstructed the ditch going East out of town. We fixed the drainage issues on Blake Cres fondly known as Blake Lake. The water is flowing much better North out of town. Culverts have been repaired and cleaned ready for next spring thaw. Road repairs have been done as needed. We have a few water challenges and are working through those as our system changes and upgrades and are being worked through. The town donated a lot for the community build and in conjunction with the RM of Aberdeen and their donation in kind, we have started building a house to sell on the market with proceeds going to the Aberdeen Rec plex. We have paid off our new town office building. We are finishing the long term Strategic Plan and Asset Management Plan, we hope to have a hard copy by December, so then we can anticipate how roads will be paved or infrastructure replaced on various streets and various community development issues. We have been asked for years about a dog park and we have acquired the long-term use of a large space from SaskTel that will be fenced as Aberdeen's first dog park. We hope that this will allow new people into our community to meet people, and allow people to exercise their animals in an off- leash setting. We want to thank all of our staff for their input and work in completing our projects, we appreciate all that you do. As a council we are only as good as our team. Wait until you see our next year's list!

- 2. Register your burn with the Provincial Fire Center at 1-866-404-4911. The Provincial Fire Centre has the ability to see where a call is coming from and if it's close to a reported controlled burn. If a passing motorist phones in to report a fire that you have not registered with the Municipality and the Provincial Fire Center, we will be forced to fine you \$500. If our fire department deems it necessary to call in fire fighters from neighboring municipalities, all costs will be forwarded to the person responsible for starting the fire.

Transfer Station

Beginning February 1**, 2017, the transfer station will be free of charge for all RM Ratepayers. RM ratepayers wishing to use the Transfer Station must have a User Card (available at the RM office during regular business hours). Cards are only valid from January 1**-December 31** of the year they were issued and must be renewed yearly in January. Open Wednesday and Saturday from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Located on the SW 12-39-03-W3. The transfer site has a waste disposal bin for household refuse which is not recyclable or burnable. Several sites have been marked for items such as white metal, burnable etc. Painted wood/pallets are not considered burnable. The site is manned and the gate is locked at all times, except during operating hours as indicated. The municipality will not tolerate garbage being dumped on Municipal roads. There is a \$500.00 fine for anyone caught dumping garbage in the municipality, and the municipality will prosecute anyone that fails to pay the fine. The Transfer Station does *not* accept old propane tanks, bale wrap/netting or grain bags. The RM of Blucher is allowing ratepayers from the RM of Aberdeen (with valid user cards) to use the waste transfer station located at NW 24-36-03-W3. The RM of Aberdeen will be covering the cost to use this station. The list of accepted items applies to both transfer stations.

Building Permits

Building permits are only valid for 12 months from the date on the permit. All expired building permits must be closed in a timely manner. To book an inspection, contact MA Inspections at 306-250-1092 or office@mainspections.ca. If an extension is required, please submit your request in writing along with your signature and the itemization of the work still required to be completed to the RM office. No building is to be occupied until after it has had a final inspection and has been deemed safe to occupy by MA Inspections & the RM Council.

<u>Taxes</u>

2017 Tax Notices were mailed out in July.

Discounts on the municipal portion for current tax payments are as follows:

September 4%, October 3%, November 2%, December no discount. All taxes are due before December 31st of the current tax year. To receive the current month's discount, payments must be received or the envelope must be date stamped by Canada Post prior to the last day of the month. Please be advised that a 1% interest charge is added on to overdue taxes on the first of every month. Please ensure you notify the municipality of any change in your address to ensure you receive your tax notice in time to receive your discount. If you have not yet provided a phone number to the RM, please do so thus we may contact you in case of emergency.

Civic Addressina

After deliberation, the council of the RM of Aberdeen No. 373 has decided to purchase and install civic addressing signs on behalf of all ratepayers, and bill the ratepayer once the cost is finalized. The RM of Aberdeen has greater purchasing power through economies of scale, and utilizing discounts available through our SARM membership will decrease the cost per sign for each individual ratepayer. Signs will be ordered through ATS Traffic and installed periodically, beginning in Division 2. Your civic address can be found on your Tax Notice or can be obtained by contacting the RM Office.
