Manitoba.


20th-23rd. Clearing skies and colder.

 Your first step should be to set up your settings as you would like to have them.



It's never too early for a SNOW REMOVAL PLAN

Snow removal will be done on roadways from Monday thru Friday, and weekends by necessity only. Sand/gravel will be spread on streets and corners where icy, and as needed to help diminish potential risks to our residents and vehicular traffic.

- Priority 1 School Route Central Avenue, Main Street, Second Avenue and Thompson Street
- Priority 2 Emergency Services Industrial Drive, Fifth Avenue South
- Priority 3 Residential Streets, Main Street Sidewalk
- Priority 4 Alleys where required.

Back alleys are Town property and NOT a storage area! Bylaw Enforcement Officer will be visiting any property owners who have left items in the alley. Please clear your back alley before snow falls for proper snow removal.



Next Council Meeting October 12th, 2017

Council meetings held the second Thursday of the month, unless changed by council. Meeting will start at 8:00 am. Council meetings are open to public observation.

Any delegations wishing to address the council will be required to contact the office the Friday prior to the meeting at the latest.

Controlled Burn

To register your controlled burn, you must register it first with the municipality by calling 306-253-4312 or Adrien Hamoline after hours and weekends at 306-230-1603. Then, you must register your burn with the Provincial Fire Center at 1-866-404-4911. The Provincial Fire Centre has the ability to see where a call is coming from and if it's close to a reported controlled burn. If a passing motorist phones in to report a fire that you have not registered with the Municipality and the Provincial Fire Center, we will be forced to fine you \$500. If our fire department deems it necessary to call in adjacent fire fighters from neighboring municipalities, ALL costs and charges will be forwarded to the person responsible for starting the fire.

Transfer Station

Beginning February 1st, 2017, the transfer station will be free of charge for all RM Ratepayers. RM ratepayers wishing to use the Transfer Station must have a User Card (available at the RM office during regular business hours). Cards are only valid from January 1st -December 31st of the year they were issued and must be renewed yearly in January. Open Wednesday and Saturday from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Located on the SW 12-39-03-W3. The transfer site has a waste disposal bin for household refuse which is not recyclable or burnable. Several sites have been marked for items such as white metal, burnable etc. Painted wood/pallets are not considered burnable. The site is manned and the gate is locked at all times, except during operating hours as indicated. The municipality will not tolerate garbage being dumped on Municipal roads. There is a \$500.00 fine for anyone caught dumping garbage in the municipality, and the municipality will prosecute anyone that fails to pay the fine. The Transfer Station is no longer accepting old Propane Tanks. Bale wrap/netting and grain bags will not be accepted at the Transfer Station.

The RM of Blucher is allowing ratepayers from the RM of Aberdeen (with valid user cards) to use the waste transfer station located at NW 24-36-03-W3. The RM of Aberdeen will be covering the cost to use this station. The list of accepted items applies to both transfer stations.

Building Permits

Building permits are only valid for 12 months from the date on the permit. All expired building permits must be closed in a timely manner. To book an inspection, contact MA Inspections at 306-250-1092. If an extension is required, please submit your request in writing along with your signature and the itemization of the work still required to be completed to the RM office. No building is to be occupied until after it has had a final inspection and has been deemed safe to occupy by MA Inspections & the RM Council.

Taxes

Tax Notices were mailed out the first week of July.

Discounts on the municipal portion for current tax payments are as follows:

September 4%, October 3%, November 2%, December no discount. All taxes are due before December 31st of the current tax year. To receive the current month's discount, payments must be received or the envelope must be date stamped by Canada Post prior to the last day of the month. Please be advised that a 1% interest charge is being added on to any overdue taxes on the first of every month.

Please ensure you notify the municipality of any change in your address to ensure you receive your tax notice in time to receive your discount. If you have not yet provided a phone number to the RM, please do so thus we may contact you in case of emergency.

Civic Addressing

After deliberation, the council of the RM of Aberdeen No. 373 has decided to purchase and install civic addressing signs on behalf of all ratepayers, and bill the ratepayer once the cost is finalized. The RM of Aberdeen has greater purchasing power through economies of scale, and utilizing discounts available through our SARM membership will decrease the cost per sign for each individual ratepayer. Signs will be ordered through ATS Traffic and installed periodically, beginning in Division 2. Your civic address can be found on your Tax Notice or can be obtained by contacting the RM Office. If you live along a road that was recently named at the July or August regular council meeting, a notice will be sent out with your new civic address.



ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING





Fire Prevention Week ~ October 8-14, 2017

Hey Kids (Kindergarten to Grade 3) enter the draw to be "Fire Chief for a Day". You could get some pretty cool things, get picked up & dropped off in the fire truck for school. Get the details from your teacher - the week of Fire Prevention.

This year's theme is: "Every Second Counts - Plan 2 Ways Out!"

- Make an Exit Plan
- Know two ways out of every room
- Get out safely and stay out
- Find your meeting place

Fire Safety Starts at Home...

Most fatal fires in Saskatchewan start in the home. Kitchen fires are the #1 cause of home fires. You can protect your family and property by taking these fire steps.

Smoke alarms save lives ONLY when they are working

- Test smoke alarms at least once a month push the test button.
- Install new batteries at least once a year or when your alarm "chirps" with a low battery warning.
- Smoke alarms do wear out replace every 10 years.

Make an escape plan

- Plan and then practice your escape. Every member of your family should know at least two ways out from every room.
- Make sure open doors and windows are easy to open. When escaping from an upper story window, plan a safe way to the ground.
- Pick a meeting place outside the home where every member of the family can gather once they've escaped.
- Know your local emergency number and call from a cell phone or a neighbor's house. Wait safely outside for the Fire Department to arrive.

Child fire play

- Children are fascinated by fire. Teach them about the dangers of fire and put fire starters out of their reach.
- Store matches and lighters up high or locked in cupboards.
- Don't leave children unsupervised around candles or open flames.
- Teach your children their part in the family escape plan.
- Let children know they should tell an adult if they find matches or lighters lying out never to touch them.

Heat safety

- Keep space heaters and wood stoves off when you go to bed or leave the house.
- Always turn space heaters off when you go to bed or leave the house.
- Never leave children alone with a working fireplace, wood stove or space heater.
- Use a metal spark screen on your fireplace.
- Have your chimney inspected once a year by a professional. Clean chimney and flue pipes of creosote build up.
- Burn only dry, seasoned wood in wood stoves and fireplaces.

Big fires start small

- Don't give fire a place to start. Keep things neat. Clear clutter and combustibles out of basements particularly near furnaces and hot water heaters.
- Never leave stove on, unattended. Use pot cover to smother fire.
- Do not overload an electrical outlet.
- Store flammable liquids like paint thinners and gasoline outside the home.
- Leave fire fighting to the experts. Fire grows surprisingly fast. Don't waste precious seconds trying to control any but the smallest fire. Get everyone out and call the Fire Department from a safe place.
- Fire safety is a way of life. Make an escape plan and practice it regularly. Put reminders to check smoke alarms on the family calendar – and when the date comes up – make the check. Make a regular fire safety inspection and correct any hazards you find.






