



 Register with the municipality: call 306-253-4312 or 306-230-1603 after hours and weekends.

2. Register with the **Provincial Fire Center at 1-866-404-4911**. If a passing motorist phones in to report a fire that you have not registered with the Municipality and the Provincial Fire Center, we will be forced to fine you \$500. If our fire department deems it necessary to call in fire fighters from neighboring municipalities, all costs will be forwarded to the person responsible for starting the fire.

Civic Address Signs

The civic address signs for the rural areas are still on order. The road crew has been installing steel posts to prepare for installing the signs. Once the signs have been received, the crew will return to install the sign.

Elections

The deadline to submit your nominations for councillors of Division 2, 4, & 6 was September 19, 2018 at 4:00pm. All three divisions have been filled by acclamation. Congrats to Mark Schaffel, the new councillor for Division 2, Real Hamoline, returning councillor for Division 4, and Jim Korpan, returning councillor for Division 6. Their term will commence and they will be sworn in at the regularly scheduled council meeting on November 8th.

<u>Taxes</u>

Tax Notices were mailed out the first week of July.

Discounts on the municipal portion for current tax payments are as follows:

September 4%, October 3%, November 2%, December no discount. All taxes are due before December 31st of the current tax year. To receive the current month's discount, payments must be received or the envelope must be date stamped by Canada Post prior to the last day of the month. Please be advised that a 1% interest charge is being added on to any overdue taxes on the first of every month. Please ensure you notify the municipality of any change in your address to ensure you receive your tax notice in time to receive your discount. If you have not yet provided a phone number to the RM, please do so thus we may contact you in case of emergency.

Building Permits

Building permits are only valid for 12 months from the date on the permit. All expired permits must be closed in a timely manner. Contact MA Inspections at 306-250-1092 or <u>office@mainspections.ca</u> to book an inspection. If an extension is required, please submit your request in writing along with your signature and the itemization of the work still required to be completed to the RM office.

Transfer Station

Please note important change: STRETCHY PLASTIC IS NOT ALLOWED IN RECYCLE BINS and must be added to regular garbage.

Please ensure you have renewed your user card for 2018. Open Wednesday and Saturday from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Located on the SW 12-39-03-W3. All refuse must be unloaded by 5:00pm – the gate locks at this time. There is a \$500.00 fine for anyone caught dumping garbage. The RM of Blucher is allowing ratepayers from the RM of Aberdeen (with valid user cards) to use the waste transfer station located at NW 24-36-03-W3. The RM of Aberdeen will be covering the cost to use this station. The list of accepted items applies to both transfer stations and can be found online.

If you suspect a rat infestation on your property or on a neighbouring property, please call Denis, at 306-220-8996. Denis is conducting site visits and will be going around to all yard sites doing inspections. Rat poison can be picked up at the office during regular business hours.

The Council of the Town of Aberdeen intends to adopt a Smoking bylaw in 2019 for the protection, promotion and preservation of the health of the residents of the Town of Aberdeen, for council to regulate and prohibit smoking within Town facilities, parks, playgrounds and sport fields in the Town. It will be known as "Smoking Regulation Bylaw No. 2019-__".

"Smoke" or "smoking" means to inhale, exhale, burn, or carry a lighted cigarette, cigar, pipe, or other lighted smoking equipment that burns tobacco, cannabis or other substance.

A person must not smoke cigarettes, cannabis or other substance, or use a nicotine delivery device:

a) in any Town-owned, operated or leased facility;

 b) within any Town playground or within 10 (ten) metres of the perimeter of any playground;

c) within 10 (ten) metres of a recreational activity area or facility within a Town park;

 d) within 10 (ten) metres of the perimeter of any Town sports field including bleachers;

e) on bleachers, in dugouts or within 10 (ten) metres of playground.

Unfortunately, our MuniSoft program is having problems with SaskTel email addresses, we have been told an update is coming in a couple of weeks. This is due to a change with SaskTel. Anytime the attached file name is greater than 70 characters it will be truncated and the extension will be changed to ".dat". This only seems to affect SaskTel email addresses and only when the person is receiving email using Outlook. There are three ways to view the bill:

- View the email using SaskTel webmail
- Select to open the file with a PDF view
- Save the attachment with a .PDF extension.

MuniSoft is working on program changes to create shorter file names. We are not the only company that has reported issues with email attachments to Sasktel.net addresses.

ABERDEEN & DISTRICT FIRE & RESCUE

"Be Aware - Fires Can Happen Anywhere!" was the theme for 2018 Fire Prevention Week.

Aberdeen & District Fire & Rescue, along with their mascot Sparky, visited the Kindergarten to Grade 3 students at Aberdeen Composite School about the importance of properly working smoke alarms, fire safety, and emergency planning.

This year **Emily Sapieha** was our "Fire Chief for a Day". She got some great prizes and was also picked up for school and taken home in the fire truck.

Draws were again made to hand out smoke alarms: Emmett, Bayze, Jett, Jack, Alex, Norah M, Hugh S, Ethan S, Jocelyn K, Wasylia, Arian N

Over the last 17 years, Aberdeen & District Fire & Rescue has handed out over 270 smoke alarms during Fire Prevention Week.

Smoke alarms save lives ONLY when they are working

- > Test smoke alarms at least once a month push the test button.
- Install new batteries at least once a year or when your alarm "chirps" with a low battery warning.
- Smoke alarms do wear out replace every 10 years.

Make an escape plan

- Plan and then practice your escape. Every member of your family should know at least two ways out from every room.
- Make sure open doors and windows are easy to open. When escaping from an upper story window, plan a safe way to the ground.
- > Pick a meeting place outside the home where every member of the family can gather once they've escaped.
- Know your local emergency number and call from a cell phone or a neighbor's house. Wait safely outside for the Fire Department to arrive.

Heat safety tips

- > Always turn space heaters off when you go to bed or leave the house.
- Never leave children alone with a working fireplace, wood stove or space heater.
- > Use a metal spark screen on your fireplace.
- > Have your chimney inspected once a year by a professional. Clean chimney and flue pipes of creosote build up.
- Burn only dry, seasoned wood in wood stoves and fireplaces.
- > Keep clutter and combustibles out of the basement, particularly away from furnaces and hot water heaters.
- Check fire extinguisher for expiration date.
- Keep live Christmas trees well-watered, check Christmas lights before decorating---discard any sets that are frayed or damaged.
- Candles can set the perfect mood for a holiday celebration, but remember to always blow out candles before leaving the room or going to bed.


