

Controlled Burn

If a passing motorist phones in to report a fire that you have not registered with the Municipality and the Provincial Fire Center, we will be forced to fine you \$500. If our fire department deems it necessary to call in fire fighters from neighboring municipalities, all costs will be forwarded to the person responsible for starting the fire.

Civic Address Signs

The RM of Aberdeen staff is working to install Civic Address signs in the rural areas. The Civic Address Signs have not yet been received from the printers. In an effort to speed up the installation process, the staff is out installing the post and will return to install the sign once it has been received.

Please note that prior to any sign being installed, Line locates must be completed. Wooden stakes are temporarily being placed until such time as line locates can be completed. Once the line locates have been completed, the wooden stakes will be replaced with a steel post. Please do not remove the wooden steaks or steel posts.

Your civic address can be found on your Tax Notice or can be obtained by contacting the RM Office. If you live along a road that was recently named at the July or August regular council meeting, a notice will be sent out with your new civic address.

Taxes

2018 Tax Notices were mailed on July 3, 2018. Taxes are due on or before December 31, 2018. A discount of 6% on the municipal portion is offered for payment in July, 5% in August, etc.; no discount is offered in December. All payments must be received or the envelope date stamped by Canada Post on or before the last day of the month. If you have not yet received your tax notice, please contact the RM Office to confirm your mailing address.

Building Permits

Building permits are only valid for 12 months from the date on the permit. All expired permits must be closed in a timely manner. If an extension is required, please submit your request in writing along with your signature and the itemization of the work still required to be completed to the RM office. Transfer Station

Please note important change: STRETCHY PLASTIC IS NOT ALLOWED IN RECYCLE BINS and must be added to regular garbage.

Please ensure you have renewed your user card for 2018. Open Wednesday and Saturday from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Located on the SW 12-39-03-W3. All refuse must be unloaded by 5:00pm – the gate locks at this time. There is a \$500.00 fine for anyone caught dumping garbage. The RM of Blucher is allowing ratepayers from the RM of Aberdeen (with valid user cards) to use the waste transfer station located at NW 24-36-03-W3. The RM of Aberdeen will be covering the cost to use this station. The list of accepted items applies to both transfer stations and can be found online.

THE SCHOLARSHIP'S HISTORY

In 1995, S.A.R.M. auctioned off the first copy of its history book, "The Building of a Province: Commemorating the 90th Anniversary of the Saskatchewan Assocation of Rural Municipalities." This auction netted the sum of \$2,600 which the S.A.R.M. Board of Directors contributed to the Canadian Centre for Health and Safety in Agriculture (CCH5A). These funds initiated the Saskatchewan Association of Rural Municipalities 90th Anniversary \$1,000 Student Scholarship in Agricultural Safety and Rural Health. The National Partners Fund at CCH5A maintains the scholarship.

GENERAL CONDITIONS GOVERNING AWARD

- 1. The winner will be announced in March and will be asked to attend the S.A.R.M. convention to accept the award.
- Two \$1500 scholarships will be awarded to the students who submits the best farm safety essay accompanied by a completed application form.
- 3. These awards are contingent upon the recipient proceeding to their first year of post secondary education in Saskatchewan. The student can be attending school outside of the province if the courses they want to take are not offered in Saskatchewan.
- 4. Students who misrepresent themselves will be eliminated from the essay competition.

Unfortunately, our MuniSoft program is having problems with SaskTel email addresses, we are currently trying to work out any glitches caused to our billing program. This is due to a change with SaskTel. Anytime the attached file name is greater than 70 characters it will be truncated and the extension will be changed to ".dat". This only seems to affect SaskTel email addresses and only when the person is receiving email using Outlook. There are three ways to view the bill:

- View the email using SaskTel webmail
- Select to open the file with a PDF view
- Save the attachment with a .PDF extension.

NEW LIFT STATION AND LAGOON UPDATE

Our new state of the art lift station is now in full operation. Contractors have now begun construction on our new lagoon. It will be located just to the north of Aberdeen. We have received installments from the Federal and Provincial governments as the proiect has progressed. Funding from the Federal Government totals \$1,500,000, Provincial \$750,000, and local \$750,000 (Town of Aberdeen). We will have used Capital reserves and infrastructure fees totaling approximately \$550,000 by year end. We will be borrowing \$200,000 (over a 3 year term) to complete this project by the March 2019 deadline.

FALL GARDEN CLEAN UP

Town maintenance staff will be picking up garden refuse ONLY on Wednesday October 10th and Thursday October 11th, 2018 (weather permitting). Please have piled for easy access. Please Note: ALL refuse must be in CLEAR bags or it will NOT be picked up. Branches must be tied in 4' bundles. Please call the Town Office to schedule a pickup. Only those that have called the office to book will have their refuse collected. Dumping of grass clippings and leaves in back alleys and the open field is NOT permitted.






