


2019 Spring Thaw

If you see water over any roads within the RM during the Spring Thaw please contact the RM Office so that our Road Crew can go out and work on unplugging culverts. Please be patient during this time, we will work as quickly as possible to maintain our roads.

Spring Weight Restrictions

At the time of the newsletter submission the spring weight bans were not yet in effect but soon will be. Hauling heavy semis or equipment on roads that are soft can create a large amount of damage to the roadway. Any costs incurred to repair damaged roads will be charged back to anyone caught damaging the municipal roads. Be advised that Drews Rd, Old 27 Rd, and Bettker Rd all have 10 ton limits.

The City of Saskatoon has imposed a 13% increase in water rates to Sk Water. In turn Sk Water will be passing on a 9.75% increase to Aberdeen effective May 1, 2019. The town residents will see a new rate of \$25.25/1000 gallons of water usage, up from \$23.00/1000 gallons.

FLOOD PREVENTION

Individual Property Owners:

- Clear neighbourhood storm water catchbasins, where present, to help water drain.
- Shovel or remove snow from around your home and move it to a position where melt water will drain away from the foundation.
- Ensure downspouts are extended so they discharge rain or melt water a minimum distance from your home to avoid it draining back towards your foundation. The suggested minimum distance is two metres.
- Check to make sure your sump pump is working. If you don't have a sump pump consider installing one. Contact a plumber for assistance if needed.
- Consider installing a mainline Sewer Backwater Valve to protect against sewer backup.
- Keep basement sewer caps in place.
 Check your basement regularly for signs of water

MUNICIPAL/SCHOOL TAX ARREARS Did you know? If you do not pay your taxes that it does not affect your credit rating? Unfortunately, it DOES affect how your community can operate. Our 2018 Tax Levy was \$616,529 As of Dec. 31/18 over \$190,000 in Municipal taxes were still outstanding and almost \$32,488 was owed to your local School Divisions. We currently have 12 properties in Tax Enforcement

New Business Tax Incentives:

A. Persons or Corporations, who construct a new building and operate a new or existing business, shall receive the following abatements, in the year following the purchase, as follows:

> First Year - 100% tax exemption of the municipal portion Second Year - 100% tax exemption of the municipal portion

Third Year - 100% tax exemption of the municipal portion Fourth Year - 75% tax exemption of the municipal portion Fifth Year - 50% tax exemption of the municipal portion Sixth Year - The new business will pay full taxes

B. Persons or Corporations, who purchase a building which has been vacant for at least 1 year and operate new or existing business, shall receive the following abatements, in the year following the purchase, as follows:

> First Year - 100% tax exemption of the municipal portion Second Year - 75% tax exemption of the municipal portion Third Year - 50% tax exemption of the municipal portion Fourth Year - The business will pay full taxes

C. Persons or Corporations who expand or renovate an existing business, resulting in an increase in assessed value, shall receive the following abatements, in the year following the purchase, as follows:

First Year - 50% tax exemption of the municipal portion Second Year - 25% tax exemption of the municipal portion Third Year - The business will pay full taxes

Hi there - my name is Curtis Wiens and I am writing this as the new pastor at Aberdeen Mennonite Church. It has been a pleasure getting to know some of the fine folks of Aberdeen and area and I look forward to meeting more of you in the future. In the Christian calendar, we are in the season of Lent - the weeks preceding Easter. A pastor friend of mine once referred to the weeks and days leading up to and including Easter as "the playoffs". On one hand, I'm sure he was referring in part to the increased work load for clergy in this season with more services taking place than usual. On another hand, with the NHL playoffs just around the corner, it is not difficult to draw a parallel between the most important hockey games of the season and the most important events in the church calendar. We get a chance to remember and reflect on the most compelling parts of the biblical story. It's true Jesus was a great teacher of peace and love, and a respected moral authority however I don't believe that's the reason we are still talking about him 2000+ years after his time on earth.
