



#### Plowing Snow

We would like to remind everyone that plowing snow onto or across municipal right-of-way is NOT a permitted practice. Guilty Parties will be subject to Fines. Plowing snow across the roadways creates ridges that settle and harden, creating serious hazards to motorists, grader operators, and potential damage to graders.

#### Garbage Bins

Garbage bins must be kept off the road allowance except for the days when garbage/recycling pickup is scheduled. Garbage bins left on the roads interfere with the road crew's ability to effectively maintain the roads and ditches. Garbage bins left on roadways can also serve as a safety hazard to other motorists. The Rural Municipality will not be responsible for any damages caused by the graders if bins are not back a minimum of 150 feet from the center of the municipal roadway.

#### Controlled Burn

- Register with the municipality: call 306-253-4312 or 306-230-1603 after hours and weekends.
- Register with the Provincial Fire Center at 1-866-404-4911.

If a passing motorist reports a fire that you have not registered with the Municipality and the Provincial Fire Center, we will be forced to fine you \$500. If our fire department deems it necessary to call in fire fighters from neighboring municipalities, all costs will be forwarded to the person responsible for starting the fire.

#### Pest Control Officer

As the weather turns colder, pests will be looking for a warm place to stay and a steady source of food. If you suspect a rat infestation on your property or on a neighbouring property, please call Denis, at 306-220-8996. Denis is conducting site visits and will be going around to all yard sites doing inspections. Rat poison can be picked up at the office during regular business hours.

#### Ike Thiessen Grid

The Ike Thiessen grid road work has been tendered out and construction will begin in Spring 2019.

#### Taxes

2018 Tax Notices were mailed out in July 2018. Taxes are due on or before December 31, 2018. All payments must be received or the envelope date stamped by Canada Post prior to the last day of the month. Please be advised that a 1% interest charge is added on to overdue taxes on the first of every month. All outstanding invoices will be added to the Taxes as arrears on January 1st and will begin to accrual Interest.

Please notify the municipality of any change in your address to ensure you receive your tax notice and other important correspondence in a timely fashion. If you have not yet provided a phone number to the RM, please do so thus we may contact you in case of emergency.

#### 2019 BUSINESS LICENSE - Bylaw No. 12-14

The Town of Aberdeen Business Bylaw 12-14 requires all businesses whether store front, home based, any trades or professions to obtain a Business License. Every license, unless suspended or revoked, shall expire on Dec. 31st of each calendar year and must be renewed by the last working day of Dec. 


#### ABERDEEN AND DISTRICT FIRE AND RESCUE

A few winter safety tips from your local fire department...

- > Never leave burning candles and plugged in electric heaters unsupervised
- Check furnace filter monthly & replace filters as needed
- Never store flammable products around furnace or hot water tank.
- Ensure energy efficient furnace vents are not obstructed by any objects. Intake vents should be checked weekly for ice buildup.
- Only use clean well-seasoned (1-year) wood in wood burning stoves and fireplaces.
- > Check and clean chimney regularly as needed.
- > Test smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors monthly push the test button.
- Smoke alarm and carbon monoxide batteries should be replaced yearly.
  - Smoke alarms should be replaced every 5 years
  - Carbon monoxide alarms replaced every 10 years or as per label on pkg.
- Check fire extinguisher for expiration date.

#### SMOKE ALARMS

Smoke Alarms are the first line of defense against toxic smoke and a deadly fire. The sound of a Smoke Alarm is your warning to leave the building. By developing and regularly practicing a fire escape plan, you will be prepared to react correctly if a fire strikes.


Smoke Alarms will only work if a charged battery is installed. Here are a few helpful hints to maintain a working smoke alarm:

- Smoke alarms belong on the ceiling of every level of the home, more the better. Install them in the basement, entrance way, hallway, and/or even in every bedroom.
- The sound of a smoke alarm usually means smoke danger.
- Clean the smoke alarm yearly. This can be done with a simple wipe with a damp cloth, vacuum or use of can air.
- Replace the battery in the smoke alarm every year. Before installing a new battery, write the date on it so
  you know when the year is up.
- Test your smoke alarm. This should be done yearly by pushing the test button on the alarm. If you cannot
  reach the alarm DO NOT stand on a chair, use a broom handle to reach the test button. If alarm does not
  sound replace the battery. If alarm still does not sound, replace the smoke alarm. Nothing is made to last
  forever.
- Replace your smoke alarm every 10 years. Smoke Alarms will have an expiry date on the back or inside the alarm.

We are here to help. If you are not sure on what or how to do a test or have any questions, please contact any of the local fire fighters or contact Adrien Hamoline at 306-230-1603.

Remember, Smoke Alarms can only warn you when they are working.




