Active from April 19th to May 28th, 2019

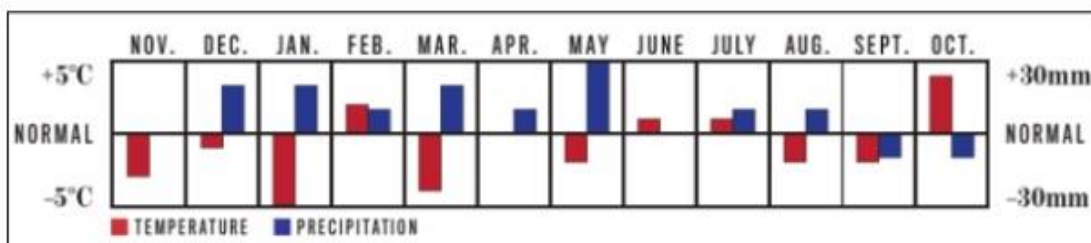
The Eta Aquariids are a strong shower when viewed from the southern tropics. From the equator northward, they usually only produce medium rates of 10-30 per hour just before dawn. Activity is good for a week centered the night of maximum activity. These are swift meteors that produce a high percentage of persistent trains, but few fireballs.

Shower details - **Radiant:** 22:32 -1° - **ZHR:** 40 - **Velocity:** 42 miles/sec (swift - 66.9km/sec) - **Parent Object:** 1P/Halley

Spring Weight Restrictions

Taxes

2019 Taxes will be levied in June/July 2019. Taxes are due on or before December 31, 2019. A discount of 6% on the municipal portion is offered for payment in July, 5% in August, etc.; no discount is offered in December. All payments must be received or the envelope date stamped by Canada Post on or before the last day of the month.

1. Register with the municipality: call **306-253-4312** or **306-230-1603 after hours and weekends.**
2. Register with the **Provincial Fire Center at 1-866-404-4911.**

If a passing motorist reports a fire that you have not registered with the Municipality and the Provincial Fire Center, we will be forced to fine you \$500. If our fire department deems it necessary to call in fire fighters from neighboring municipalities, all costs will be forwarded to the person responsible for starting the fire.

Property Assessments

All properties are revaluated by the Saskatchewan Assessment Management Agency (SAMA) based on a four-year cycle. 2017 was a revaluation year. Only properties with changes over the past year will have Assessment Notices mailed to you in 2019. The Assessment Notice is the official notice of the assessed value of your property as determined by SAMA. Your assessment notice will have the appeal form on the back of the sheet as well as the deadline for an appeal. The 2019 Deadline to appeal will be 30 days from the mailing date of the assessment notice. **This notice and time-frame is the only opportunity for appealing assessments during the year.** If you disagree with the property value established by SAMA, there is a formal appeal process available to you. Appeals must be based on an error in your property assessment and not based on the amount of taxes paid for the property. Property reports may be viewed on the SAMA website www.samaview.ca/sama/. Please check our website or Facebook page for updates on the deadline and other important information.

Building Permits

Building permits are only valid for 12 months from the date on the permit. All expired permits must be closed in a timely manner. Contact MA Inspections at 306-250-1092 or office@mainspections.ca to book an inspection. If an extension is required, please submit your request in writing along with your signature and the itemization of the work still required to be completed to the RM office. Forms & information for builders is available at www.mainspections.ca

The City of Saskatoon has imposed a 13% increase in water rates to SK Water. In turn SK Water will be passing on a 9.75% increase to Aberdeen effective May 1, 2019. The town residents will see a new rate of \$25.25/1000 gallons of water usage, up from \$23.00/1000 gallons.

New Business Tax Incentives: (Must apply in writing for eligibility)

A. Persons or Corporations, who construct a new building and operate a new or existing business, shall receive the following abatements, in the year following the purchase, as follows:

First Year - 100% tax exemption of the municipal portion
 Second Year - 100% tax exemption of the municipal portion
 Third Year - 100% tax exemption of the municipal portion
 Fourth Year - 75% tax exemption of the municipal portion
 Fifth Year - 50% tax exemption of the municipal portion
 Sixth Year - The new business will pay full taxes

B. Persons or Corporations, who purchase a building which has been vacant for at least 1 year and operate new or existing business, shall receive the following abatements, in the year following the purchase, as follows:

First Year - 100% tax exemption of the municipal portion
 Second Year - 75% tax exemption of the municipal portion
 Third Year - 50% tax exemption of the municipal portion
 Fourth Year - The business will pay full taxes

C. Persons or Corporations who expand or renovate an existing business, resulting in an increase in assessed value, shall receive the following abatements, in the year following the purchase, as follows:

First Year - 50% tax exemption of the municipal portion
 Second Year - 25% tax exemption of the municipal portion
 Third Year - The business will pay full taxes

Introduction

The Water Security Agency (WSA) requires that at least once each year waterworks owners provide notification to consumers of the quality of water produced and supplied as well as information on the performance of the waterworks in submitting samples as required by a Permit to Operate a waterworks. The following is a summary of the Town of Aberdeen water quality and sample submission compliance record for the Jan. 1st to Dec. 31st 2018 time period. This report was completed on March 29, 2019. Readers should refer to the Agency's [Municipal Drinking Water Quality Monitoring Guidelines, November 2002, EPB 202](#) for more information on minimum sample submission requirements and the meaning of type of sample. Permit requirements for a specific waterworks may require more sampling than outlined in the Agency's monitoring guidelines. A minimum of 0.1 milligrams per litre (mg/L) free chlorine residual is required for water entering the distribution system. Tests are normally performed on a daily basis by the waterworks operator and are to be recorded in operation records. This data includes the number of free chlorine residual tests performed, the overall range of free chlorine residual (highest and lowest recorded values) and the number of tests and percentage of results not meeting the minimum requirement of 0.1 mg/L free chlorine residual. Water is supplied by the City of Saskatoon and is chloraminated so there is rarely a free chlorine residual. The system operates on total chlorine residual.

All waterworks serving less than 5000 persons are required to submit water samples for WSA's General Chemical category once every two years if a ground water source and once per three months every second year if a surface water or blended surface/groundwater source. The General Chemical category includes analysis for alkalinity, bicarbonate, calcium, carbonate, chloride, conductivity, hardness (as CaCO₃), magnesium, sodium, sulphate and total dissolved solids.

*Objectives apply to certain characteristics of or substances found in water for human consumptive or hygienic use. The presence of these substances will affect the acceptance of water by consumers and/or interfere with the practice of supplying good quality water. Compliance with drinking water aesthetic objectives is not mandatory as these objectives are in the range where they do not constitute a health hazards. The aesthetic objectives for several parameters (including hardness as CaCO₃, magnesium, sodium and total dissolved solids) consider regional differences in drinking water sources and quality.

Orange cranberry romaine salad

- 1 medium head of Romaine lettuce, torn
- 2 c. drained orange segments 500 mL
- 1 c. sliced celery 250 mL
- 3 green onions, sliced
- 3/4 c. dried cranberries 130 g
- 3/4 tsp. poppy seeds 15 mL
- 1/4 c. canola oil 50g
- 1/4 c. vinegar 50 g
- 1/4 c. sugar 55 g
- 1/4 tsp. salt 5 g

In a large salad bowl, mix lettuce with the oranges, celery, onions, cranberries and poppy seeds.

In a small bowl, combine canola oil, vinegar, sugar and salt. Pour over salad, toss and serve immediately.

If you have a sunny south-facing window you could grow a couple of multiplier onions, and a small container of fresh lettuce.

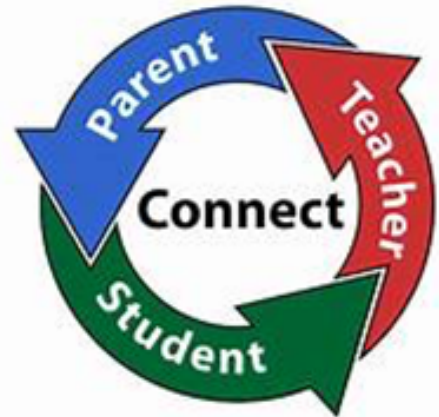

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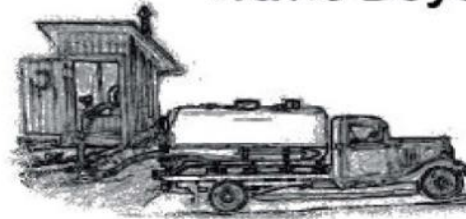
