

Animals Roaming at Large

Keeping animals within your property is the responsibility of the owner. If your animals are roaming within the RM, steps can be taken to detain the animals and all costs incurred in doing so will be the responsibility of the animals' owner.

Controlled Burn

With the drier than usual weather conditions, the RM council would like to remind everyone to take extreme caution while having a controlled burn. Don't forget to register your Controlled Burns

- Register with the municipality: call 306-253-4312 or 306-230-1603 after hours and weekends.
- Register with the Provincial Fire Center at 1-866-404-4911.

If a passing motorist reports a fire that you have not registered with the Municipality and the Provincial Fire Center, we will be forced to fine you \$500. If our fire department deems it necessary to call in fire fighters from neighboring municipalities, all costs will be forwarded to the person responsible for starting the fire. Please ensure you have proper Fire Fighting Insurance coverage.

Building Permits

Building permits are only valid for 12 months from the date on the permit. All expired permits must be closed in a timely manner. If an extension is required, please submit your request in writing along with your signature and the itemization of the work still required to be completed to the RM office. PLEASE NOTE THAT MA INSPECTIONS HAS MERGED WITH BUILDTECH INSPECTION and BuildTECH will be taking over all open building permit files.

Helpful tips to save water and money!

If all the earth's water is represented by a 4L jug, only about 30 mL – less than 1% - would be the easily accessible freshwater required to support all human needs including industry, agriculture, drinking and washing.

A low-flow showerhead saves as much as 10 L of water per minute.

Keep a jug of water in the fridge. This eliminates the need to run the tap until it's cold, saving 7-12 L of water per minute.

Run the dishwasher and washing machine only when they're fully loaded. Each unnecessary load wastes 70-190 L of water.

Your tap uses 7-12 L of water per minute while it runs, so turn off while shaving and brushing your teeth.

Try taking shorter showers. This can save between 6-19 L of water per minute. A new, water-efficient toilet can save as much as 14 L of water per flush compared to an older model. This can save up to 70 L of water per person, per day.

Save 6-30 L of water per flush by only flushing when necessary and avoid using the toilet as a wastebasket.

Regularly check your faucets, pipes and toilets for leaks. If found, have the leaks fixed as soon as possible to avoid further waste.

If you have a water softener or reverse osmosis system, they use a lot of water — check your specific model.

HOW TO CHECK FOR LEAKING TOILETS

- Flush your toilet as usual. Wait for the water to rise again to the designated water line of the tank and the toilet to fully complete the flush.
- 2. Drop 4-5 drops of red or blue food coloring in the toilet tank.
- Replace the toilet lid and wait 15 minutes.
- 4. If the water in your toilet bowl is clear there is no leak. If the water has changed color there is a leak.
- Repeat the process with ALL toilets in the house, if applicable. This is very important to see if the issue is coming from one specific toilet or happening in multiple ones.

ALSO, check ALL sinks and bathtubs for drips or worn out taps.

Leaking Faucets:

Leaking faucets are generally a result of a worn rubber washer. The washer on a sink is usually located under the handle.

As winter approaches the maintenance crew would like to request that you move anything that is close to your property line so that it will not interfere with snow removal. We don't want our side arm to cause any damage. Thank you.

ABERDEEN & DISTRICT FIRE & RESCUE

"Not Every Hero Wears a Cape - Plan and Practice Your Escape!" was the theme for 2019 Fire Prevention Week.

Aberdeen & District Fire & Rescue, along with their mascot Sparky, visited the Kindergarten to Grade 3 students at Aberdeen Composite School about the importance of properly working smoke alarms, fire safety, and emergency planning.

This year **Emilee Lutze** was our **"Fire Chief for a Day".** She got some great prizes and was also picked up for school and taken home in the fire truck.

Draws were made for smoke alarms. Over the last 18 years, Aberdeen & District Fire & Rescue has handed out over 300 smoke alarms during Fire Prevention Week.

Smoke alarms save lives ONLY when they are working

- Test smoke alarms at least once a month push the test button.
- Install new batteries at least once a year or when your alarm "chirps" with a low battery warning.
- Smoke alarms do wear out replace every 10 years.

Make an escape plan

- Plan and then practice your escape. Every member of your family should know at least two ways out from every room.
- Make sure open doors and windows are easy to open. When escaping from an upper story window, plan a safe way to the ground.
- Pick a meeting place outside the home where every member of the family can gather once they've escaped.
- Know your local emergency number and call from a cell phone or a neighbor's house. Wait safely outside for the Fire Department to arrive.

Heat safety tips

- Always turn space heaters off when you go to bed or leave the house.
- Never leave children alone with a working fireplace, wood stove or space heater.
- Use a metal spark screen on your fireplace.
- Have your chimney inspected once a year by a professional. Clean chimney and flue pipes of creosote build-up.
- Burn only dry, seasoned wood in wood stoves and fireplaces.
- Keep clutter and combustibles out of the basement, particularly away from furnaces and hot water heaters.
- Check fire extinguisher for expiration date.
- Keep live Christmas trees well-watered, check Christmas lights before decorating---discard any sets that are frayed or damaged.
- Candles can set the perfect mood for a holiday celebration, but remember to always blow out candles before leaving the room or going to bed.

Kitchen/appliance fires are still the #1 cause of house fire ~ BE SAFE!






