

### <u>Next Council Meeting</u> April 9th, 2020

Please note the date change for this meeting, Council has moved the monthly meeting up by one week. Meeting will start at 9:00 am. Council Meetings are open to public observation. Any delegations wishing to address the council will be required to contact the office the Friday prior to the meeting at the latest.

### Office Closure

Effective March 19, 2020, the RM office will be closed to the public, however, we remain open for business, and are committed to maintaining our ongoing work for our ratepayers. Should you wish to drop off a cheque for the payment of an invoice, please drop it in the drop slot on the outside of the office building and we will provide a receipt via mail.

### Emergency Services

In case of an emergency please call 911. Ensure that you are familiar with your Civic Address and Land Location in order to aid the emergency services in a quick response time to your location.

### Saskatchewan Municipal Hail Association

Owners of land may withdraw all, but not part, of their cultivated land from the operations of the Municipal Hail Insurance Act by filing a withdrawal application with the Association on or before March 31st. Withdrawal forms may be obtained from the Municipal office.

### **Building Permits**

Building permits are only valid for 12 months from the date on the permit. All expired permits must be closed in a timely manner. If an extension is required, please submit your request in writing along with your signature and the itemization of the work still required to be completed to the RM office. Please note that MA Inspections has merged with BuildTECH Consulting & Inspections Inc. and BuildTECH will be taking over all open building permit files. Call or Text Nicole at BuildTECH Inspections at 306-370-2824 to book your inspection.

### Pest Control Officer

If you suspect a rat infestation on your property or on a neighbouring property, please call Denis, at 306-220-8996. Denis is conducting site visits and will be going around to all yard sites doing inspections. Rat poison can be picked up at the office during regular business hours.

### Custom Work 2019 Rates

**RM Shop 306-253-4330** (please leave a detailed phone message) or call the Office at 306-253-4312 Ratepayers \$120 per hour - \$60.00 Minimum Charge plus PST.

Non Ratepayers & Developers \$160 per hour- \$80.00 Minimum Charge. Work Authorization Form must be filled out before any work will be performed. If you rely on the rural municipality for custom work, please note that the rural municipality's policy is to clear all roads first before any private custom work is done.

### Spring Weight Restrictions

The spring weight bans will soon will be in effect. Hauling heavy semis or equipment on roads that are soft can create a large amount of damage to the roadway. Any costs incurred to repair damaged roads will be charged back to anyone caught damaging the municipal roads. Be advised that Drews Rd, Old 27 Rd, and Bettker Rd all have 10 ton limits.

### Property Assessments

The assessment roll is now open and may be viewed at the RM Office, mon-fri, 8:00am -4:30pm until April 24<sup>th</sup>, 2020. The Assessment Notice is the official notice of the assessed value of your property as determined by SAMA. Your assessment notice will have the appeal form on the back of the sheet. The 2020 Deadline to appeal will be April 24<sup>th</sup>, 2020 at 4:30pm. **This notice and time-frame is the only opportunity for appealing assessments during the year**. If you disagree with the property value established by SAMA, there is a formal appeal process available to you. Appeals must be based on an error in your property assessment and not based on the amount of taxes paid for the property. Property reports may be viewed on the SAMA website. Please check our website or Facebook page for updates on the deadline and other important information.

### Transfer Station

The Aberdeen Transfer Station will remain open at this time, with some minor changes to operations. To ensure the health and safety of our Transfer Station Attendant during the Covid-19 pandemic, the attendant has been instructed limit interactions with the public. Town residents are still required to pay with Tokens when dropping off their garbage. Tokens can be purchased at the Town office and at Gido's Convenience Store.

The RM council will continue to monitor the situation and may impose changes as needed. Please follow us on Facebook to receive regular updates regarding the Transfer Station and other RM services.

### Spring Ratepayers Supper

After much discussion, Council feels it would be in the best interest of the ratepayers to postpone the Annual Ratepayers Supper usually scheduled in April, due to the concerns surrounding COVID-19. The new date is still to be determined.

URGENT: When using disinfectant wipes please know that the wastewater plant CANNOT process them. They need to be disposed of in the garbage, not flushed down toilets. Wipes, including baby wipes, napkins, paper towels and tissues are clogging up pumps and equipment at the wastewater treatment plant.

Over time, back lanes can deteriorate, forming ruts, pot holes and low spots due to an extreme change in weather conditions, regular vehicle traffic, drainage from private properties, overgrown vegetation, and large equipment.

- To prevent deterioration of your back lane, residents should trim back any overgrown trees on their property.
- Our equipment is getting lights broken, windshield cracks, and other damage from these large branches.
- To assist our maintenance staff, residents should avoid adding topsoil or other materials along the fence/property line so that operators have full view of any potential hazards that could damage equipment or fences.

Please DO NOT leave any items in the alley.

Taxes are imposed the first day of January in each year and are due July 31.

Please remember there is NO discount for the School Portion of Taxes

Tax <u>Estimate</u> Notices for 2020 taxes were sent in December 2019. 2020 Tax Notices will be sent mid May, once the School Division levies have been established and the Municipal Mill Rate has been set.

### FLOOD PREVENTION

- Individual Property Owners:
- Clear neighbourhood storm water catch-basins, where present, to help water drain.
- Shovel or remove snow from around your home and move it to a
  position where melt water will drain away from the foundation.
- Ensure downspouts are extended so they discharge rain or melt water a minimum distance from your home to avoid it draining back towards your foundation. The suggested minimum distance is two metres.
- Check to make sure your sump pump is working. If you don't have a sump pump consider installing one. Contact a plumber for assistance if needed.
- Consider installing a mainline Sewer Backwater Valve to protect against sewer backup.
- Keep basement sewer caps in place.
- Check your basement regularly for signs of water.

### Leaks Cost Money

Drip: 1 drip/second wastes 32.7 L daily and 11,937.6 L yearly Dribble: 3 drips/second wastes 98.1 L daily and 35,813.2 L yearly Drool: 5 drips/second wastes 163.5 L daily and 59,688.6 L yearly Toilets: A running toilet could be wasting more than 750 L of water in a day. Showerheads: A showerhead that drops 10 drip/minute wastes more than 1,800 L per year.

All new buildings and additions greater than 100 square feet in building area are required to meet the National Energy Code of Canada. There is a 3-page form that needs to be filled out when you take out your building and development permits. This 3-page form is not required for unheated detached garages or sheds.

### Building Permits

### Are required prior to construction beginning for:

All New Dwellings, Garage, Sheds – 100 sq ft & over (10x10 or larger), Decks, Additions, Basement Development, Structural changes to existing buildings.



In light of the Covid19 pandemic we will be closing the Town Office to the public from Friday, March 20, 2020, to Monday April 6, 2020. Up until Thursday 5:00pm we will have a sign on the door asking those that have flu like symptoms to refrain from entering the building, but rather drop payments in the mail slot, or phone/email from home with any questions.

We are encouraging residents who have not yet signed up for e-billing or on line/e-transfer to do so. We will continue to have staff in the office during these dates from 9:00am - 12:00pm and 1:00pm - 5:00pm to answer any questions by telephone, text or email only. Our Maintenance Staff will not be interacting with the public but will continue with their duties as needed, so please if you have any questions of them, again direct them to the Town Office. For the March Utility billing we will not be reading meters but prepare an estimate only. We ask those that do not send payments by e-transfer or online banking to wait the 2 weeks to pay their bill so we don't need to visit the bank during this time. There will be no public meeting this year and our thoughts and thanks go out to all of the workers world-wide who remain at work to protect the health and safety of others while putting themselves at risk during this world pandemic.

The annual day for Safety and Health at work promotes the prevention of occupational injury and diseases globally. It is

part of a campaign to raise awareness and intended to focus international attention on the magnitude of the problem and on how promoting and creating a safe and healthy culture in the workplace can reduce the number of work-related deaths, illnesses and injuries. Its purpose is to honor the memory of victims of occupational incidents and diseases.

While we honor the injured, the ill and the fallen workers on April 28<sup>th</sup>, we recognize the day as one for commemoration and for mobilization, we must also recognize that these injuries and fatalities can be prevented by having a strong health and safety culture in our workplaces.

- Over 100 countries recognize a world day for safety and health at work on April 28th.
- In 1988 Saskatchewan proclaimed The Victims of Workplace Injuries Day of Mourning Act.
- In 1990 the Federal Government passed the Workers Mourning Day Act.
- In 2003 the International Labour Organization (ILO) recognized the International Memorial Day to promote health and safety as a basic human right across the globe.

### Coronavirus disease (COVID-19): How to isolate at home when you have COVID-19

### Organization: Public Health Agency of Canada Date published: March 2020

Isolation means staying at home when you are sick with COVID-19 and avoiding contact with other people to help prevent the spread of disease to others in your home and your community.

### If you have been diagnosed with COVID-19, it is expected that you take the following measures.

### Limit contact with others

•Do not leave home unless absolutely necessary, such as to seek medical care.

- •Do not go to school, work, other public areas or use public transportation (e.g., buses, taxis).
- Arrange to have groceries and supplies dropped off at your door to minimize contact.
- •Stay in a separate room and use a separate bathroom from others in your home, if possible.

• If you have to be in contact with others, keep at least 2 metres between yourself and the other person. Keep interactions brief and wear a mask.

- ·Avoid contact with individuals with chronic conditions, compromised immune systems and older adults.
- •Avoid contact with pets if you live with other people that may also be touching the pet.

### Keep your hands clean

•Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, and dry with disposable paper towels or dry reusable towel, replacing it when it becomes wet.

•You can also remove dirt with a wet wipe and then use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.

- •Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth.
- Cough or sneeze into the bend of your arm or into a tissue.

### Avoid contaminating common items and surfaces

 At least once daily, clean and disinfect surfaces that you touch often, like toilets, bedside tables, doorknobs, phones and television remotes.

 Do not share personal items with others, such as toothbrushes, towels, bed linen, utensils or electronic devices.

•Use regular household disinfectants or diluted bleach (1 part bleach and 9 parts water) to disinfect.

 Place contaminated items that cannot be cleaned in a lined container, secure the contents and dispose of them with other household waste.

Put the lid of the toilet down before flushing.

### Care for yourself

. Monitor your symptoms as directed by your health care provider or public health authority.

 If your symptoms get worse, immediately contact your health care provider or public health authority and follow their instructions.

•Get some rest, eat a balanced diet and stay in touch with others through communication devices.

### Supplies to have at home when isolating

- Surgical/procedure masks (do not re-use)
- Eye protection
- Disposable gloves (do not re-use)
- Disposable paper towels
- Tissues
- ·Waste container with plastic liner
- Thermometer
- •Over the counter medication to reduce fever (e.g., ibuprofen or acetaminophen)
- Running water
- Hand soap
- Alcohol-based sanitizer containing at least 60% alcohol
- Dish soap

- Regular laundry soap
- Regular household cleaning products
- Bleach (5% sodium hypochlorite) and a separate container for dilution (1 part bleach to 9 parts water)
- Alcohol prep wipes
- Arrange to have your groceries delivered to you
