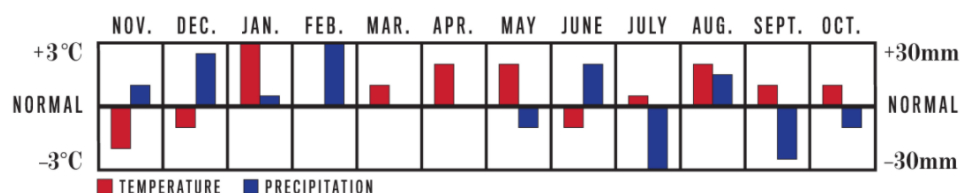

Saskatchewan Municipal Hail Association

Owners of land may withdraw all, but not part, of their cultivated land from the operations of the Municipal Hail Insurance Act by filing a withdrawal application with the Association on or before March 31st.

Equipment Updates

In an effort to combat icy intersections, the road crew will be operating a sander truck. **Please stay back from all snow removal equipment but especially the sander.** The sander will be spreading small pebbles that may cause damage to vehicles if followed too close. Please stay at least 15 meters back.

In addition to the sander we are also starting out a new grader. This equipment has been purchased to help us with our road maintenance program.

Plowing Snow

We would like to remind everyone that plowing snow onto or across municipal right-of-way is NOT a permitted practice. Guilty Parties may be subject to fines as per Bylaw 2018-01. Plowing snow across the roadways creates ridges that settle and harden, creating serious hazards to motorists, grader operators, and potential damage to graders.

Controlled Burn

Don't forget to register your Controlled Burns

1. Register with the municipality: call **306-253-4312** or **306-230-1603 after hours and weekends.**
2. Register with the **Provincial Fire Center at 1-866-404-4911.**

If a passing motorist reports a fire that you have not registered with the Municipality and the Provincial Fire Center, we will be forced to fine you \$500. If our fire department deems it necessary to call in fire fighters from neighboring municipalities, all costs will be forwarded to the person responsible for starting the fire. Please ensure you have adequate Fire Fighting Insurance coverage.

Pest Control Officer

As the weather turns colder, rats will be looking for a warm place to stay and a steady source of food. If you suspect a rat infestation on your property or on a neighbouring property, please call Denis, at 306-220-8996. Denis is conducting site visits and will be going around to all yard sites doing inspections. Rat poison can be picked up at the office during regular business hours.

Building Permits

Building permits are only valid for 12 months from the date on the permit. All expired permits must be closed in a timely manner. If an extension is required, please submit your request in writing along with your signature and the itemization of the work still required to be completed to the RM office. 2021 Business Licenses

According to Bylaw 12/14 the Business License Bylaw, all Home Based, Store Front and Contractor Business Licenses for 2021 are due December 31, 2020, and are valid until December 31, 2021.

License fees:

Home Based Business \$25 annually

Store Front Business \$75 annually

Contractor \$100 annually

General Contractor \$300 (covers the trades, as part of the building permit)

The offence for conducting business without a Business License is \$200. Bylaw Enforcement will be issuing fines for non-compliance.

Please note: Issues are caused at our new lift station due to oils, fats, hygiene products, wipes and misc. items being flushed down our sewer lines. Public works staff found miniature shampoo bottles, 2 to 3 feet thick chunks of fat around pipes and pumps. They have also found tennis balls, wire, pop cans and small toys.

When frying food any leftover grease can be chilled until it hardens and thrown out in the garbage.

This lift station has not even been operating for a year. These fixes are very costly....please do not dispose of these items down your drain. Thank you. Town of Aberdeen Public Works.



SNOW CLEARING

Residents may help by clearing the front of their property where sidewalks exist. Bylaw 03/13 prohibits residents from placing any snow, ice, dirt or other obstruction, swept or cleaned from private property onto any street, sidewalk, lane, ditch, drain or sewer.

Many times, the Town Office receives calls from residents regarding the snow removal equipment depositing snow at the end of driveways. Unfortunately, this is a reality of snow plowing, and it cannot always be avoided. If you have a neighbor who is unable to remove their snow from in front of their driveway please assist them, as we often do not have the resources to go back and clear driveway approaches. We ask for your cooperation and understanding as our staff performs the work of keeping our streets open and safe during the winter.

SNOW REMOVAL PRIORITY

Snow removal will be done whenever there is an accumulation of snow on roadways from Monday thru Friday, and weekends by necessity only. Sand/gravel will be spread on streets and corners where icy, and as needed.

Priority 1 School Route – Central Avenue, Main Street, Second Avenue and Thompson Street

Priority 2 Emergency Services – Industrial Drive, Fifth Avenue South

Priority 3 Residential Streets

Priority 4 Alleys where required

Please Note; A layer of snow on roadways is not a bad thing, it helps protect the underground infrastructure such as sewer and water lines from freezing up in frigid temperatures.

Taxes are imposed the first day of January in each year and are due July 31.

Please remember there is NO discount for the School Portion of Taxes

Tax Estimate Notices for 2021 taxes will be sent in December 2020. 2021 Tax Notices will be sent mid May, once the School Division levies have been established and the Municipal Mill Rate has been set.

Aberdeen Creative Preschool
Preschool Teacher - Statement of Work

The Aberdeen Creative Preschool is looking for to fill the position of Term Preschool Teacher while the incumbent teacher is on maternity leave.

Job Responsibilities

The Term Preschool Teacher will be diligent and faithful in the performance of his/her duties as teacher during the period of his/her term and to perform such duties as the Preschool Board may reasonably require. These duties may include but are not limited to:

1. The Term Preschool Teacher shall be responsible for instructing and supervising the children on the preschool program planned and coordinated by the incumbent Preschool Teacher.
2. Provide reasonable supervision of all children at all times until released into the care of a parent or guardian.
3. Be responsible for classroom maintenance from set-up through to and including cleanup. Lock and secure the classroom at the end of each class session.
4. Recommend to the Preschool Board the withdrawal from preschool of any children for health, discipline, or other reasonable cause.
5. Report to the Preschool Board with respect to any required supplies or equipment and act as an advisor in the selection of equipment and supplies; receipts must be submitted to the treasurer for all purchases.
6. The Term Preschool Teacher shall maintain an up to date CPR and First Aid accreditation. The Term Preschool Teacher must submit a photocopy of accreditation to the Preschool Board as a condition of employment.
7. The Term Preschool Teacher is required to have a criminal and vulnerable record check completed with the results being sent to the Aberdeen Creative Preschool; a clear record is required as a condition of employment.

Term of Position

The Term Preschool Teacher position will be required for Tuesdays and Thursdays from April 20, 2021 through to June 17, 2021 with the possibility of extension. Preschool runs from 9:00am – 12:00pm and the Term Preschool Teacher will be required to be in the classroom at least 30 minutes prior to the start of class and remain until the last preschooler goes home and the classroom is tidied, sanitized, and ready for the next class time.

There will be a cross over period during the month of April 2021 to transition the new teacher into the position in an effort to keep the program as consistent as possible and to make it easier for the preschoolers.

Salary

For the duration as specified, the Term Preschool Teacher shall be paid \$650.00 per month. The Employer agrees to pay such salary on or before the last teaching day of each month during the agreement.

Aberdeen First Responders

Aberdeen First Responders are here to help our residents in the Town of Aberdeen and the RM of Aberdeen and those visiting or driving through when a medical emergency happens. We are dispatched by 9-1-1 to medical emergencies such as cardiac arrest, stroke, injury and more. We are also dispatched to motor vehicle collisions.

A little about us. We are a group of volunteers within the Town of Aberdeen and the RM of Aberdeen. We have been trained by Saskatchewan Health Authority to provide you the best pre-hospital care and assessments until an ambulance arrives with advanced first aid. We are trained every year in CPR at the Healthcare Provider level. We do monthly training to maintain our skills, practice our skills and to learn new skills. We also attend training annually to expand our skills and knowledge.

As 2021 is now upon us, we wanted to share what to expect when we arrive on scene. Depending on the nature of the call, you will see different attire. We will always wear gloves, a mask, a gown and eye protection (goggles or face shield). However, there are calls that may require us to wear a helmet or other protective equipment as well.

There are many reasons to call 9-1-1. These include, but not limited to: heart attack, stroke, weakness, seizures, illness that requires ambulance transport, vehicle collisions and injuries. When you call 9-1-1, the dispatcher will ask you many questions about the situation, the responding ambulance service is dispatched and then first responders. Upon arrival, first responders will ask questions regarding COVID, then continue with questions about the situation and do an assessment. When the responding ambulance service arrives, they will ask the same questions and take over your care.

During the current pandemic, if you are experiencing any of the signs and symptoms of COVID or have been in contact with someone with COVID, we ask that you let the 9-1-1 dispatcher know so we can attend your call safely. Also know, that if any of our first responders experience the same, that individual will not attend a call.

Every year, our Light the Tree campaign raises funds for the Aberdeen First Responders. Monies raised from our Light the Tree campaign are used for purchasing equipment. We wish to thank each and every person that contributed and to the businesses that collected on our behalf. We would like to thank everyone for their continued support throughout our years of service to the community.
