



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TEMPERATURE AND PRECIPITATION NOVEMBER 2020 TO OCTOBER 2021

Equipment Updates

In an effort to combat icy intersections, the road crew will be operating a sander truck. **Please stay back from all snow removal equipment but especially the sander.** The sander will be spreading small pebbles that may cause damage to vehicles if followed too close. Please stay at least 15 meters back.

In addition to the sander we are also starting out a new grader. This equipment has been purchased to help us with our road maintenance program.

Snow Removal

The Municipality would like to extend our gratitude for your patience and understanding as we deal with large amounts of snow this winter. Your assistance in reporting problem areas is appreciated and we request your continued patience as our road crew continues to fight the elements to provide safe, passable roads this season

Taxes/ Outstanding Invoices

2020 taxes were due on or before December 31, 2020. As of January 1st, all outstanding taxes will begin collecting a penalty of 1% per month. All payments must be received or the envelope date stamped by Canada Post on or before December 31st to avoid penalty charges. All outstanding invoices from 2020 will be added to the taxes as arrears and will begin to accumulate penalty charges.

Plowing Snow

We would like to remind everyone that plowing snow onto or across municipal right-of-way is NOT a permitted practice. Guilty Parties may be subject to fines as per Bylaw 2018-01. Plowing snow across the roadways creates ridges that settle and harden, creating serious hazards to motorists, grader operators, and potential damage to graders.

Controlled Burn

Don't forget to register your Controlled Burns

- Register with the municipality: call 306-253-4312 or 306-230-1603 after hours and weekends.
- Register with the Provincial Fire Center at 1-866-404-4911.

If a passing motorist reports a fire that you have not registered with the Municipality and the Provincial Fire Center, we will be forced to fine you \$500. If our fire department deems it necessary to call in fire fighters from neighboring municipalities, all costs will be forwarded to the person responsible for starting the fire. Please ensure you have adequate Fire Fighting Insurance coverage.



As the weather turns colder, rats will be looking for a warm place to stay and a steady source of food. If you suspect a rat infestation on your property or on a neighbouring property, please call Denis, at 306-220-8996. Denis is conducting site visits and will be going around to all yard sites doing inspections. Rat poison can be picked up at the office during regular business hours.

Building Permits

Building permits are only valid for 12 months from the date on the permit. All expired permits must be closed in a timely manner. If an extension is required, please submit your request in writing along with your signature and the itemization of the work still required to be completed to the RM office. 2021 Business Licenses

According to Bylaw 12/14 the Business License Bylaw, all Home Based, Store Front and Contractor Business Licenses for 2021 are due December 31, 2020, and are valid until December 31, 2021.

License fees:

Home Based Business \$25 annually

Store Front Business \$75 annually

Contractor \$100 annually

General Contractor \$300 (covers the trades, as part of the building permit)

The offence for conducting business without a Business License is \$200. Bylaw Enforcement will be issuing fines for non-compliance.

It is important that Aberdeen and District area residents know just how many local businesses and people it takes to keep the ARC operating and that those responsible for the daily operations recognize those contributions.

ABERDEEN AND DISTRICT FIRE AND RESCUE A few winter safety tips from your local fire department...

- Never leave burning candles and plugged in electric heaters unsupervised
- Check furnace filter monthly & replace filters as needed
- Never store flammable products around furnace or hot water tank.
- Ensure energy efficient furnace vents are not obstructed by any objects. Intake vents should be checked weekly for ice buildup.
- > Only use clean well-seasoned (1-year) wood in wood burning stoves and fireplaces.
- Check and clean chimney regularly as needed.
- Test smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors monthly push the test button.
- Electric heater Check for broken insulation/cracked wiring.
- Keep live Christmas trees well-watered to prevent drying out; turn off Christmas lights before leaving home or going to bed.
- Smoke alarm and carbon monoxide batteries should be replaced yearly.
 - Smoke alarms should be replaced every 5 years
 - Carbon monoxide alarms replaced every 10 years or as per label on pkg.
- > Check fire extinguisher for expiration date or low pressure.
- > Talk to your local fire fighters with any questions.




