


Owners of land may withdraw all, but not part, of their cultivated land from the operations of the Municipal Hail Insurance Act by filing a withdrawal application with the Association on or before March 31st.

- 2. Register with the Provincial Fire Center at 1-866-404-4911.

If a passing motorist reports a fire that you have not registered with the Municipality and the Provincial Fire Center, we will be forced to fine you \$500. If our fire department deems it necessary to call in fire fighters from neighboring municipalities, all costs will be forwarded to the person responsible for starting the fire. Please ensure you have adequate Fire Fighting Insurance coverage.

### 2021 Business Licenses

According to Bylaw 12/14 the Business License Bylaw, all Home Based, Store Front and Contractor Business Licenses for 2021 are due December 31, 2020, and are valid until December 31, 2021.

- License fees:
- Home Based Business \$25 annually
- Store Front Business \$75 annually
- Contractor \$100 annually

General Contractor \$300 (covers the trades, as part of the building permit)

The offence for conducting business without a Business License is \$200. Bylaw Enforcement will be issuing fines for non-compliance.

From the Pastor's desk:

It's been nearly a year since the pandemic turned our lives upside-down. So many things have changed! It's hard to remember what it was like to get together in large groups the way we used to. And at the church, that was a large part of our regular routine. Sunday mornings aren't the only reason for the church to exist, but as a group, much of our identity is tied to those weekly gatherings. One of the things we did to adapt to the new pandemic reality was to hold outdoor, drive-in worship services. Using a low-power radio transmitter, folks could get the sound through their vehicle's radio. When we moved back into the church building when the weather turned cold, we faced a limit of the number of people allowed inside. We continued to use the radio transmitter and some people have listened to the service from their vehicle outside the church building. The audio of our church services can be heard every Sunday morning at 11:00 on **90.1 fm**. Actually, the range of the signal covers a good portion of town so you may be able to pick it up from home ... if you still have a radio in your home. 


