

Bylaw Beat:

Bylaw 2018-01 – A Bylaw to Restrict the Placement of Snow Cleared from Private Lands on Roads

When clearing snow from private property, including but not limited to driveways, snow shall not be piled:

- On the road way
- Anywhere within the road allowance, including the ditch, to a height higher than one (1) foot below the lowest part of the roadway



Did you know: In the 2020 election, only 124 residents voted for a say in their municipal council? According to the 2024 census, Aberdeen has approximately 555 eligible voters. That means that only 22% of the eligible voters came out and voted.

It's never too early for a SNOW REMOVAL PLAN

Snow removal will be done on roadways from Monday thru Friday, and weekends by necessity only. Sand/gravel will be spread on streets and corners where icy, and as needed to help diminish potential risks to our residents and vehicular traffic.

Priority 1: School Route – Central Avenue, Main Street, Second Avenue and Thompson Street

Priority 2: Emergency Services – Industrial Drive, Fifth Avenue South

Priority 3: Residential Streets, Main Street Sidewalk

Priority 4: Alleys where required.

Back alleys are Town property and NOT a storage area! Bylaw Enforcement will be visiting any property owners who have left items in the alley. Please clear your back alley before snow falls for proper snow removal.

Bylaw Enforcement

A month has gone by since Bylaw commenced in the Town of Aberdeen and approximately 35 warning letters have been issued. These warning letters provide the owners with notice of the Bylaw in which they are in contravention of as well as a time frame to correct before being issued fine(s) and/or orders to remedy.

While we understand that receiving these letters may leave a 'sour taste' in a residents mouth, the Office staff are more then happy to answer any questions you may have regarding the letter.

Please note- There is ZERO TOLERANCE for harassment and/or abuse to staff. While we understand you may be upset, please treat us with the same respect we treat you.

UPDATES:

- The old lagoon decommission is COMPLETE
- The Water Pumphouse Project has been scheduled to begin in the Spring of 2025 and completion is set for 2026. This new pumphouse will have a 3 days supply of water held in a new reservoir to offset any possible disruptions to the water supply coming to town.



I thought I would take this opportunity to introduce, or re-introduce myself, to you. My name is Ryan White and I am currently the Mayor of Aberdeen and am running for re-election again this upcoming term. I'll tell you a little about who I am, what I have done and my vision for the next 4 years should I be re-elected.

Who I am...

I'm 49, married with 2 adult children and have lived in Aberdeen since August 2007. I have been a Police Officer for the City of Saskatoon since December 2005. In this role I have been a lead provincial firearms instructor at the Saskatchewan Police College and am currently a Search Manager on our public order unit and work patrol.

I am also an active Volunteer Firefighter for the last approximately 7 Years and Volunteer First Responder for the last 6 in our community.

Lastly, I have been a member of Municipal Council for 6 years and Mayor for the last 4.

What I have done...

As Mayor and councillor, I have led and been a contributing part of a team of passionate and strong-willed people that has secured almost 7 million dollars in Government grants for lagoon and reservoir improvements, building a foundation for Aberdeen to grow- all without the huge increase to taxes or levies to our ratepayers. To allow for the application of these grants, we implemented a strategic plan to allow for the securing of grants and clear, specific goals for the direction of the town and its resources.

In the first year of my Term as Mayor, we had to deal with the complexity of the Arc struggling as a public facility and work with a private group to allow it to not only be refurbished but flourish and continue to serve the residents of Aberdeen.

We have almost finalized the creation of a dedicated training ground for the Fire Department and First Responders- not only giving them much needed space to train safely and maintain and grow their skills, but repurposing the location of the old lagoon and donated SeaCans to ensure no additional costs to our ratepayers. We hope to develop this site into a multi- Fire Department Training facility where other Fire Departments can partake in larger training opportunities.

We have strengthened the relationship between the town and RM, our closest neighbour and developed strong lines of communication.

On top of all this, we have navigated many "bumps in the road" and issues when they arose- even when sometimes the issue was the bumps in the road.

What I want to do...

- Create a new subdivision with large lots to bring steady, measured growth and residents who want to plant roots and become a part of our amazing community
- Create a space for youth to call their own and to allow them to gather and interact without the constant "buzz" of social media
- Create a more open dialogue with the residents to allow more people to have input into the civic process
- Create a community walking path to connect the community and allow residents to get out, meet and interact year round

I have a strong vison for Aberdeen. I want us to continue to grow and bond as a community. I see us becoming a place people move to raise families, a place people recommend to their friends and families. But a vision without a community behind- it is just that an idea. I will be out and about meeting you and I want your ideas and vision for Aberdeen. I have proven I can lead a group of varied and passionate people and guide them to a single purpose of bettering our community.
